Organization Of Church Sponsors Entry To Country

Roseburg's second Dutch family is scheduled to arrive by ship in New York City today after the first leg of its journey to the western United States.

The five members of the Pieter Jan Ongers family will take a train to Portland and finish the 7,000-mile journey to Roseburg by bus.

The family is being sponsored in Roseburg by the First Baptist Church through its Men's Fellowship and Women's Missionary Society, which form part of the church's Christian Social Relations organization.

Members of the family are the father, who is 28; the mother, Maria, 24; and three sons, Gerrit, 7; Eduard Jacobus, 5; and Anthonie, 3.

The church has already secured a furnished apartment at 414 NE Winchester St. for the family, according to Mrs. Charles Hafer, chairman of the Christian Social Relations organization. She asked that any church members having extra household articles donate them to the family.

Pieter Ongers is an electrical mechanic. He has been employed as a mechanic constructing electrical apparatus, a mechanic in a machine factory, and as a technician in a broadcasting station. Most recently he had been a bench hand and welder.

He says he hopes to be able to get a job in the aircraft industry. He said he has had wide experience in working with jet aircraft.

The family comes from Amsterdam. It boarded the Dutch ship Guiderkrus Jan. 21. The members of the family are eligible for emigration to the United States because Pieter was a war victim, having been arrested by the Nazis during World War II. They will enter the U.S. under the Refugee Rehabilitation Act.

The first Dutch family to be brought to Roseburg under a program being promoted by the National Council of the Churches of Christ in the U.S.A. arrived late last year under the sponsorship of the First Presbyterian Church.

The Methodist Church has also announced it will bring a Dutch family here.

Ongers and his wife are members of the Christian Reformed Church.

The Baptists last year made arrangements to bring another Dutch family to Roseburg, but friends met the family in New York and arranged to have them live there instead.

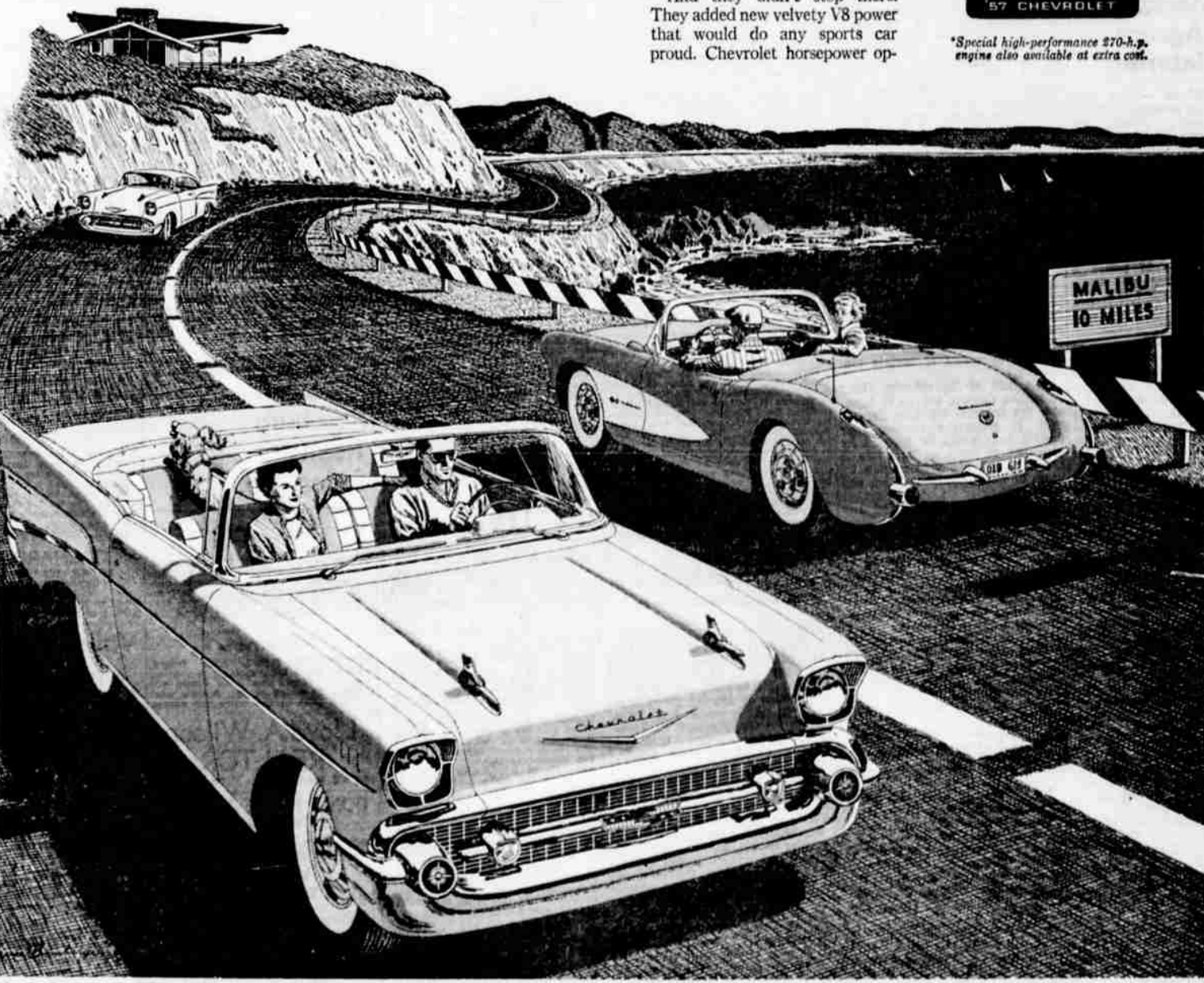
