

Roseburg School Board Buys Backhoe For Excavation Uses On School Property

A three-year struggle to find money in the Roseburg school budget for a backhoe for ditching and other excavation ended Monday night for Guy Davis, superintendent of buildings and grounds for the school district.

The school board unanimously okayed Davis' request for a \$2,500 emergency allotment from federal aid money set aside for maintenance, repair and operation of buildings and equipment owned by the district.

The decision came after an exhibit by Davis showed that the district could save money on excavation and backfill on the Eastwood School preparation job if the schools owned the backhoe.

A backhoe, for those who don't know or haven't guessed, is a shovel-sort of attachment on the rear of a tractor. Its primary function is ditch-digging and related jobs.

For the past three years, Davis has requested purchase of that particular machine by budgeted funds. And each time, the school budget committee has deleted the item.

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Glide School Board Begins Work On New Budget; Pay Scale For Teachers Studied

The Glide school board has begun work on the budget for 1957-58, and one of the first items facing it is a list of recommendations involving increases in teacher salaries.

The recommendations were presented to the board at the latest meeting by the Economic Welfare Committee of the Glide Education Assn. The association invited lay people and board members to join in deliberations of the salary project.

At the meeting, Donald Brand, chairman of the Teachers' Salary Committee, Ray Coffenherry, assistant chairman, and Mrs. Willard McClure, member of the lay committee, presented the recommendations.

The major recommendation was that teachers in the district's schools be placed on a salary schedule adopted by the board in 1955-56. The report from the committee said the adjustment to the new schedule should be completed by the 1957-58 year.

It was stipulated in the schedule adopted by the board in 1955-56 that no raise over \$200 be allowed yearly. The committee asked that this be eliminated because it would deter some teachers from becoming part of the adopted schedule.

Another recommendation is to grant increments of \$200 from the third year forward on bachelor degrees and high training categories. Still another major item is to raise the maximum
