SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Crown Zellerbach Corp. Thursday announced a \$4 a ton increase in newsprint, effective March 1.

The raise will bring the company's price to \$134 a ton, fob, Pacific Coast seaports.

G. E. Young, vice president, said Crown Zellerbach's newsprint is consumed principally in the West.

Miss Chapman is 17 years old and a native of Roseburg. She is a senior at Roseburg High and has been a student of Trued for nearly two years. She formerly studied with Mrs. Charles S. Heinline.

She has served as accompanist for the major musical productions at the high school, has participated in the high school summer music camp at the University of Oregon and has performed solos in public on numerous occasions.

Her plans after graduation are to enter college and devote at least part time for music study.

Miss Hill was born in Port Townsend, Wash. She is a 15-year old sophomore at Roseburg High School.

She has studied with various teachers in Oregon and Washington, most recently at the Portland Conservatory of Music, before coming to Roseburg nearly two years ago.

All-Jet B52 Bombers To Arrive At Fairchild
