

Climber Spends Night On Ledge

STEVENSON, Wash. — A Portlander who learned to like mountain climbing while serving an eight-year hitch in the Marine Corps, was rescued at 3 a. m. Thursday from a ledge high up on the massive basalt monolith, Beacon Rock, near here.

Robert J. Boyle, 24, was chilled and suffering mildly from shock when an eight-man rescue team took him off in a cable-suspended sling.

He had taken advantage of Wednesday's clear, warm weather to attempt a descent on the sheer face of the 850-foot rock that rises

up from the Columbia River near Bonneville Dam. But at the 700-foot level his rope hitch became snagged. After 4½ hours, his series for help were heard by Mrs. Clarence Rudhe, wife of the Beacon Rock State Park forester.

The rescue climbers, from Portland, Hood River and Vancouver, worked with cap lights and scant illumination from car lights far below. When they got him secure in the sling, they pulled him to the top and safety.

Bill Would Impound Drunk Drivers' Cars

SALEM — Automobiles involved in drunken driving cases could be impounded under a bill introduced Tuesday by Sen. Jean Lewis (D), Portland.

Cars could be impounded for 90 days for the first offense, and for a year on each subsequent offense.

The owner would have to pay storage costs.

Mrs. Lewis said such punishment would be more effective than jail sentences, as now provided.

Eisenhower Says Strength Gained Through Faith

WASHINGTON — President Eisenhower told a congressional prayer breakfast Thursday that strength for common tasks is gained through unity in faith and hope.

Eisenhower sent a message to the gathering of about 1,000 Congress members, government and business leaders at the Mayflower Hotel. It was read by Vice President Nixon who said a meeting of the National Security Council prevented Eisenhower from attending.

"In the company of fellow believers, united in faith and hope, there is strength for renewed effort to serve our God and neighbor," Eisenhower's message said.

"In such a spirit the magnitude of our common tasks diminishes; the obstacles to their accomplishment less and less formidable."

"This is a time to confront our common problems with confidence. I am sure the nation and the world can and will find the wisdom and courage, the inspired leadership required for the living of these days."

The breakfast was sponsored by the International Council of Christian Leadership. It was the fifth annual such breakfast. Eisenhower attended last year.

Pet Monkey Playing With Matches Blamed

EUGENE — A pet monkey, playing with matches, was blamed Wednesday for a fire which damaged a carport and brought death to the monkey.

Firemen said the blaze burned a doghouse in which the monkey was living and damaged a nearby carport. The monkey, owned by the Rev. Minnie Edwards, perished in the fire.

FLYING TO BURMA

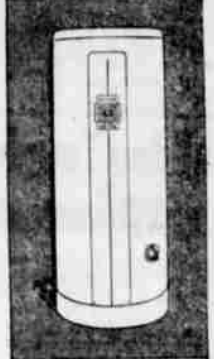
