Vets Schooling Bill Approved By Oregon House

SALEM — The House passed 35-23 and sent to the Senate Tuesday a bill extending until June 30, 1959, the date on which World War II veterans can begin their study under the \$50 monthly state educational aid.

This aid expired last Dec. 31. Rep. William A. Greenfield (D), Portland, told the House that the extension is needed for a few veterans who haven't been able to start their college and vocational courses yet.

But two other Democrats, also veterans, opposed the bill. They were Reps. Robert B. Duncan, Medford, and Keith D. Skelton, Eugene.

Duncan said "Some day we'll have to set a cut-off date. We owe an obligation to the citizens, and we need to save all the money we can."

Skelton called the bill "class legislation," and said 12 years is long enough for veterans to determine whether they want to go to school.

Supporting the bill were 33 Democrats and 10 Republicans. Opposing it were 14 Democrats and 9 Republicans.

Britain Opens Drive To Create Trade Zone

PARIS — Britain Tuesday opened a drive to create an all-Europe industrial free trade zone this year.

Sir David Eccles, chairman of the Board of Trade, urged a top-level conference of the Organization for European Economic Co-operation to push along with the planning in order to complete the draft treaty by July.

The zone would include 17 countries with a population of 300 million, one of the largest—and potentially the richest—markets in the world.

All would be able—after a trial and error period of perhaps 15 years—to buy and sell freely in all member countries.

Oil Prices Rollback Expected Voluntarily

WASHINGTON — Sen. O'Mahoney (D-Wyo.) says he thinks increasing public reaction to recent oil price increases will lead to a voluntary rollback by the oil companies involved.

The longer such a price reduction is delayed, O'Mahoney said Sunday night, "the greater will be the call for legislation" to lower oil prices.

Allegations that the industry boosted prices to take advantage of the situation created by the closing of the Suez Canal already have touched off two Senate investigations. O'Mahoney heads one of them. Sen. Pastore (D-R.I.) is planning another. A federal grand jury probe also is scheduled.

HOPES TO BUY CANNON

MADRID — King Saud of Arabia hopes to buy Spanish anti-aircraft cannon, Spanish government sources reported Tuesday.

The monarch spent the morning examining 20 and 40 m.m. rapid fire cannon at a military camp outside Madrid. Saud also expressed interest in light arms, especially an automatic rifle.

WASHINGTON — Sen. William Langer (R-ND), hospitalized last week with pleurisy and pneumonia, has shown some improvement. But Langer, 70, is "still considered critically ill."
