Rising Water Temperature Brings Rush Of Steelheads

Checkers at the game commission's fish counting station at Winchester Dam probably wish migrating fish would be a little more considerate. After the workers had spent most of the first two weeks of February trying to stay awake, having virtually no work to keep them busy, the fish ganged up and swept over the fishway at the rate of nearly 600 in the last two days of the period. Low water temperature and flows have greatly retarded the movements of winter steelheads so far in the season. Steelheads, it is reported, are very erratic in their movements. They travel in numbers only when water conditions are favorable. The winter steelhead migration is now the only active movement in the river, the fall chinook and silver salmon migrations having been completed. Appearance of spring chinook is anticipated in the very near future. The winter steelhead total is considerably above average to date, despite unfavorable water conditions. In the period from Feb. 1 to Feb. 15 checkers counted 723, of which number, as previously stated, approximately 600 came on the 14th and 15th when water temperature rose to 42 degrees. 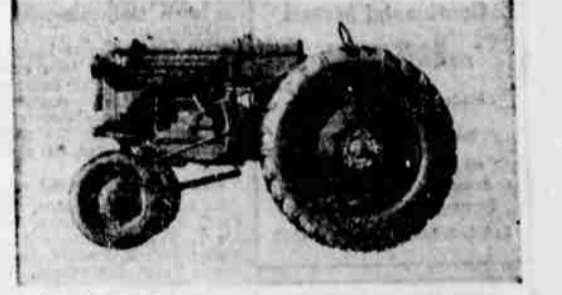

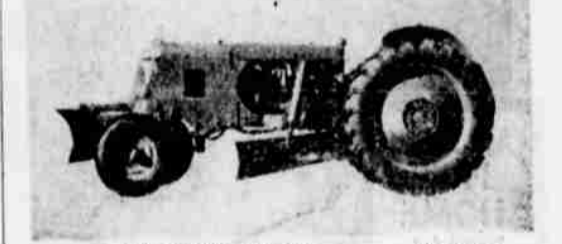
