Evergreen Takes Stand Against Key District Plan

The Evergreen Grange has taken a stand against re-organization of school districts in the county under the so-called "Key district" plan now before the Legislature.

The grange did not take a stand against the principal, according to correspondent Mrs. George A. McDowell, but did not like the way it was set up.

The grange also voted against support of a bill which would bring about closure of banks on Saturday. Mrs. McDowell said the grange members felt it would "work a definite hardship on a large majority of grange people."

A third bill was not acted upon. It concerned construction of a dormitory for Future Farmers of America and 4-H club members at the State Fairgrounds. The grangers decided not to commit themselves until it was determined how the construction would be financed.

The actions were taken at the last meeting of the grange. It was announced at that meeting that the open house date has been changed to March 9.

At the same meeting, Master John Lander gave the first and second degree obligations to Douglas and Leona Briggs, new members. Charles Slabaugh was appointed youth chairman. Later he gave a report on grange insurance. Agricultural Chairman Emery Baker gave a report on small grains and grasses, warning that there will be a shortage this year.

Five Killed When Arabs Attack Egyptian Station

CAIRO, Egypt — At least five persons were killed Tuesday when about 500 Palestinian Arab soldiers clamoring for arms attacked an Egyptian police station in the suburb of Maadi.

Police immediately clamped a tight lid of secrecy on the incident, and refused even to admit that any trouble had occurred. Eyewitnesses said, however, that at least five were killed, several wounded and more than 20 arrested when the Palestinians attempted to storm the police station from two directions to get arms and ammunition.

FIREMEN FIND BODY

SALEM, Ore. — Salem firemen found the body of three-year-old Dana Parker in the swirling waters of Pringle Creek, shortly before 1 p.m. Tuesday.

The child, son of Dr. and Mrs. Dale Parker of Salem, had fallen some brush about eight blocks into the creek Monday morning. The body was lodged under from the point where Dana was last seen.

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One Killed, 26 Injured As Bus Hits Streetcar

SAN FRANCISCO — One man was killed and 26 persons were injured Tuesday when a crowded Municipal Railway bus hit a streetcar and then a power pole.

At 7:20 a.m. an inbound No. 26 bus, crowded with work-bound passengers, hit a J streetcar which was coming from the Geneva car barns in the outer Mission district.

Then it shot across the street and hit a steel pole with an impact that smashed its front.

Frank W. Casebolt, 53, a Muni Railway car cleaner aboard the bus, was killed.

Rescuers had to tear away wreckage to free Walter Tompkins, 46, bus driver who was wedged in his seat.

The impact knocked passengers to the floor of the bus, whose brakes apparently failed.
