Portland Labor Racket Not Only One, Mundt Says

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Mundt (R-SD) says a special Senate committee investigating racketeering in labor and industry has "a dozen cases as bad as" a situation it is probing in Portland, Ore.

Mundt is a member of the committee which heard testimony last week concerning alleged alliances between officials of the powerful Teamsters Union and underworld elements.

The hearing resumes tomorrow. Committee Chairman McClellan (D-Ark) said James P. Elkins, a Portland gambler, will be recalled then for questioning about his pri-

Langley, Crosby Next

Kennedy said the committee will call William M. Langley, Multnomah County (Portland) district attorney now under indictment, and Clyde C. Crosby, organizer for

the teamsters in Oregon, Wednesday.

He said Crosby will be questioned about his connections as a member of the Portland City Exposition - Recreation Commission. It has been charged in testimony that Crosby was allied with Portland underworld figures in efforts to influence selection of a site for an eight-million-dollar coliseum.

SALEM (AP) — The House passed and sent to the Senate Wednesday a bill that would permit district attorneys to give legal advice to county treasurers.

The law now excludes treasurers among county officials.

District attorneys now also would defend treasurers in suits.

Court Upholds Reyes' Guilt

SALEM (AP) — The Oregon Supreme Court Wednesday upheld the conviction of Martin H. Reyes, charged with the slaying of James Roy Applegate of Corvallis while resisting arrest.

Reyes was convicted of second-degree murder.

Reyes, with another prisoner, had been transferred from Grants

Pass to Eugene. Armed with a gun he had concealed, Reyes escaped from the Eugene jail and stole two automobiles as he fled toward Corvallis.

He was cornered in Corvallis after wrecking one of the cars, but disarmed Applegate, a Corvallis policeman, and attempted to take the officer's car containing Applegate's two daughters and another girl.

Applegate grappled with Reyes and was shot three times.

Reyes was indicted for first-degree murder and appealed his conviction of second-degree murder.

The court said, "The assault was obviously committed for the purpose of avoiding capture and the killing of Applegate was in furtherance of that purpose."

The slaying occurred Oct. 24, 1955.
