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Glide, Vik Stars Top UVL Scoring

The performers who led Glide and Myrtle Creek to first and second place finishes in the Umpqua Valley League, 6-1 Dick Smith and 6-4 John Losey, finished head and shoulders above the rest of the pack in the individual league scoring chase.

Smith totaled 284 points for the 12 league contests for a 23.8 spree per outing while Losey was not too far behind with 240 markers and an even 20 points per game average.

The list of top 20 scorers for the league season then drops down to the 11.4 average and 137 total of Glendale's sparkling guard Billy Hale. Two Sutherlin players, guard Skip Stillwell and forward-center Norm Walling round out the top five scorers with 129 and 128 points respectively.

PCC Basket Crown Depends On 2-Game Cal-USC Series

California's Golden Bears battle for the Pacific Coast Conference basketball title this weekend while UCLA waits to see if it can slip in the back door with the crown.

Washington also stands a chance to share in the laurels of the close race.

The balance of power rests with Southern California, a team without a chance at the top spot. California plays USC Friday and Saturday nights in Los Angeles. Should the Bears win both times, they'd win the title with no dispute.

If California loses both games to Southern California's Trojans and Washington splits its two games with Washington State at Pullman, the crown would go to UCLA, which has finished its season with a 13-3 record.

If California, 12-2, splits with USC and Washington, 11-3, beats USC twice, the race ends up in a three-way tie with no playoff.

Regardless of this week's outcomes, California has won the spot in the NCAA regional playoffs at Corvallis, Ore., since both UCLA and Washington are banned.

That goes back to the PCC action on the under-the-table aid cases involving football players. The conference has limited penalties to football but the NCAA bans that followed included the other sports.

Another traditional series with no effect on first place, comes in Oregon where the University of Oregon and Oregon State meet

International Boxing Club Ruled Monopoly By Judge

NEW YORK (AP)—Federal Judge Sylvester J. Ryan ruled Friday the International Boxing Club of New York, Inc., is a monopoly to restrain trade.

He found the club, its officers and affiliates guilty of monopoly to restrain interstate trade and foreign commerce in promoting and presenting professional championship bouts throughout the United States.

"The defendants, as a result of their activities, acquired power during the period covered by the complaint (June 1, 1949, to May 15, 1953) to exclude competitors from the promotion of championship contests in the United States," the judge said in a 58-page opinion.

The antitrust suit was brought by the government.

Named as defendants, besides the IBC of New York, were the IBC, Inc. of Illinois; Madison Square Garden Corp.; James D. Norris, president of the New York IBC, and Arthur M. Wirtz, Chicago IBC president.

The Garden is a large stock-

holder in the two IBC organiza-

tions.

The government had charged

that the defendants, in violation

of the Sherman Antitrust Act, con-

spired to restrain and monopolize

interstate and foreign commerce

in the promotion exhibition, broad-

casting, telecasting and motion

picture production and distribu-

tion of professional championship

boxing bouts.
