

State Revises Virus-Free Stone Fruit Selections

SALEM — For the benefit of Oregon nurserymen growing fruit tree nursery stock, the State Department of Agriculture has issued a revised list of stone fruit selections that are virus-free or carry only a minor virus disease. The list covers sweet and sour cherries and plums.

It was prepared by Dr. Julius L. Heinis, department plant disease survey pathologist, and Dick Hemmerling, nursery inspector, on the basis of research work done with Dr. J. A. Mithrath of the Oregon Experiment Station.

The current list eliminates some of the selections made in 1954 because they carried a virus that make them less desirable for planting stock than those substituted.

This information, available to anyone interested, carries an evaluation of the various stone fruit sources used for nursery stock orchards and propagation stock.

Morgan Issues Another Order To Traction Co.

SALEM — Public Utilities Commissioner Howard Morgan issued another order Monday to require Portland Traction Co. to restore service to the west side of downtown Portland.

The order is similar to the one a month ago, but that one was stayed on appeal by the company to the circuit court.

Morgan hopes the new order will be effective because it was issued after the completion of the hearings on the matter. The first order was issued before hearings were complete.

The company was warned that if it doesn't comply, Morgan will bring suit to collect penalties.

He held that the company is making 20 per cent profit on its investment, and that it wants to get rid of its passenger service so it can sell its freight operations to a major railroad.

FIRE, EXPLOSION

PORTLAND — Fire and an explosion caused damage estimated at \$1,000 to a southeast district tavern just before Monday midnight.

Kadar Arrives For Soviet Visit

MOSCOW — Hungarian Premier Janos Kadar arrived in Moscow today and hailed the Soviet Union as his country's "truest and most dependable friend."

The Hungarian official and his party were flown here in a Soviet jet airliner for 10 days of "ideological and economic" negotiations with the Kremlin.

On hand to greet the visitors at the airport were Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev, President Klementi Vorshilov, Deputy Premier Georgi Malenkov, A. I. Mikoyan and Mikhail Suslov and other members of the Presidium.

Also present despite the 18-degree below-zero temperature were some 500 "spontaneous demonstrators" recruited for the occasion. Most Western ambassadors boycotted the welcome ceremony.

Lana Turner Isn't Considering Matrimony

HOLLYWOOD — Lana Turner just back from a film festival in Uruguay, says: "Getting married is the last thing in my mind right now."

Her comment, made upon her arrival yesterday, came in reply to a New York newspaper's story the actress planned to marry a wealthy Brazilian, Luis Santos Jacinto.

"Isn't that the very end?" said Miss Turner. "Her I am not even divorced."

She and actor Lex Barker separated four weeks ago.

"I've known this man for 11 years." "All my Brazilian friends travel in a group. We lunch together, dine together. Luis is a very serious young man with a business. He's never even been to the United States."

Clairvoyant Horse Dead At Age 33

RICHMOND, Va. — Lady Wonder, a brown mare with a reputation as the "swami" of the four-legged set, is dead at the advanced age of 33.

A veterinarian attributed the horse's death this week to a common human failing, a heart attack.

Over the years Lady attracted almost as much attention pecking away at a horse-sized typewriter contraption in her stall as did her more fleet-footed relatives on the nation's tracks.

Her mistress, Mrs. Claudia Fonda, claimed Lady could read minds and was clairvoyant. There were many who were willing to concede this while skeptics insisted if there was any clairvoyance it was possessed by Mrs. Fonda herself.

But whether it was clairvoyance or sheer coincidence, Lady's "answers" more than once caused a flurry of excitement.

In 1932 the mare was credited by police in Quincy, Mass., with providing clues that led to the finding of the body of Danny Matson, a 4-year-old child missing for two years.

A psychologist and specialist on extra-sensory perception, Dr. J. B. Rhine of Duke University, once said Lady gave evidence of some telepathic ability. He later asserted, however, there was evidence of signaling.

Interest In Artistic Chimp's Work Spreads

BALTIMORE — Interest in Betsy, the Baltimore Zoo's artistic chimpanzee, has spread to the learned halls of Harvard.

Dr. Henry A. Murray, professor of psychology at Harvard, said he is interested in comparing Betsy's abstract art with that of children.

He asked zoo director Arthur R. Watson is the 7-year-old chimp is angry when she paints.

Not at all, said Watson. "Once in a while her mood seems to be let's get it over with." But mostly she is very intrigued, not angry at all."

Legislature Revises Population Base Law

SALEM — The Legislature finally has revised a law that is based on population of cities as of 47 years ago.

The population of those cities was based on the census of 1910. The Senate completed action Tuesday on the bill, which would use the most recent federal census.
