SP Traffic Higher, But Net Earnings Said Down
SAN FRANCISCO — Freight traffic volume was higher, but net earnings of Southern Pacific were smaller last year. President D. J. Russell told stockholders Wednesday.

In the company's 73rd annual report, Russell told 68,100 stockholders "rising costs squeezed us against the rigidity of the railroad industry's regulated price structure."

Net income of Southern Pacific transportation system in 1956 was \$46,461,927, plus \$7,902,347 earned by solely controlled affiliated companies, minus a \$27,370 loss on Mexico operations, for a total net income of \$54,364,274.

This compared with a net of \$56,245,672 in 1955. The 1956 income was equivalent to \$6.91 a share of Southern Pacific's capital stock, against \$6.22 in 1955.
