Yoncalla Grade School pupils today are receiving their patch tests for tuberculosis.

The date was announced at the last Yoncalla PTA meeting at the grade school, according to correspondent Mrs. George Edes.

It was also announced that all children will be given polio shots the second Wednesday in May in the Yoncalla Methodist Church by the County Health Dept. The PTA tabled the subject of paying for polio shots for all those over 21 years of age.

At the same meeting, new officers were elected. Mrs. Ray Probstel was elected president. Other new officers for the coming year are: Mrs. Russell Loyd, first vice president in charge of programs; Mrs. Quentin Rychard, second vice president in charge of ways and means; Mrs. Eldon Lee, secretary; and Mrs. Arlo Thomas, treasurer.

Featured speakers during the meeting were Wayne Flynn, principal of Yoncalla High School and Kenneth Barneburg, county superintendent.

Flynn gave a report on the availability of scholarships. He said it costs between \$1,000 and \$1,200 per year for a student to attend college. Barneburg gave a report on taxes, pending legislation, consolidation and teacher tenure in smaller schools.

LEGALITY QUESTIONED

SALEM — Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton ruled Friday that a civil rights bill in the Legislature "would be subject to constitutional attack."
