At least 12 members of the Douglas Fir District of Boy Scouts of America will attend the fourth national jamboree this summer at Valley Forge, Pa.

The train taking the 160 boys from the six counties that make up the Oregon Trail Council will stop for tours near points of interest at Chicago, New York, Washington, D. C., Detroit, Denver, San Francisco and other major cities. Coming back, they will have three days in New York, where they'll see Manhattan, the United Nations and two major league baseball games. The jamboree itself at the 1,500-acre tent city will start July 9 and continue through July 19. The boys return to Oregon July 27.
