THE EASTER MESSAGE

St. Matt. 28: 1-7

In the end of the Sabbath, as it began to dawn toward the first day of the week, came Mary Magdalene and the other Mary to see the sepulchre.

And, behold, there was a great earthquake: for the angel of the Lord descended from heaven, and came and rolled back the stone from the door, and sat upon it.

His countenance was like lightning, and his raiment white as snow:

And for fear of him the keepers did shake and became as dead men.

And the angel answered and said unto the women, "Fear not ye: for I know that ye seek Jesus which was crucified."

He is not here: for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay.

"And go quickly and tell His disciples that He is risen from the dead; and, behold, He goeth before you into Galilee: there shall ye see Him: Lo, I have told you."

St. Mark 16: 1-8

And when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, and Mary, the mother of James, and Salome, had brought sweet spices, that they might come and anoint him.

And very early in the morning the first day of the week, they came unto the sepulchre at the rising of the sun.

And they said among themselves, "Who shall roll us away the stone from the door of the sepulchre?"

And when they looked, they saw that the stone was rolled away: for it was very great.

body in the country a dollar bill and still have some dollar bills left over. That would indicate that it paid somewhere around 170 million dollars.

Let's put it like this: If this big concern's income tax had been DOUBLED, it would have saved YOU as an individual (theoretically) only a dollar — one measly dollar bill, enough to buy about four packages of cigarettes or maybe two or three gallons of gasoline.

And — If its taxes had been doubled — it would have had to raise the prices of its products, so that in the course of time you would have lost the dollar.

The point is that taxation is a highly complicated subject, with many, many ramifications.

Here's one ramification: Suppose we relieved ALL individuals of ALL taxes and socked the wicked corporations with the whole load.

What would happen then?

Here's what would happen: The corporations — which, big and little, produce the bulk of the goods we consume — would then have to RAISE THEIR PRICES SHARPLY. Either that or they would all go broke and their employees would lose their jobs and their stockholders would lose their investments.

And — The increase in prices would take out of your pocket what you would save by having no taxes to pay.

Douglas Delegation Backs Holmes' Selections

To the Editor: The bias of your editorial re Governor Holmes' appointment of Avery Thompson to the post of District Attorney is understandable. Your inaccuracies, however, are not.

When Mr. Stults was elected District Attorney he had the nomination of both the Republican and Democrat parties. He could have rejected the Democratic nomination had he chosen to do so. In that event, a candidate could have been selected to run on the Democratic ticket against him in the general election. When Mr. Stults saw fit to accept IN WRITING the nomination of the Democratic party and to accept in writing the party, he held himself out to the people as representing both parties; hence, it is entirely proper, legal and ethical that his successor be a member of either party.

I am sure that everyone agrees with you that Governor Holmes selected a most capable attorney when he chose Avery Thompson to be the successor in the District Attorney's office. Relative to other appointments made by Governor Holmes your statement that he has appointed only "party faithfuls" is contrary to the fact. You apparently have chosen to disregard the appointment of J. W. Forrester of Pendleton as member of the State Board of Higher Education and Mr. R. B. Chessman of Astoria as member of the State Highway Commission. Also appointed to major office was Mrs. John Galey who is a member of the State Industrial Accident Commission and the State Unemployment Compensation Commission. Mrs. Galey is a member of the Republican Party. The first two named are Independents.

Other Republicans who have been appointed are Ural Naves and Del Milne who were appointed to the State Fair Board and Mr. Shy Huntington who was reappointed to the Racing Commission. It is to be expected that the Governor will appoint Democrats to most state positions. The people at the last election indicated that they wanted a Democrat Governor and it is reasonable to presume that he will appoint people of our state who are members of his party; however, it has been the policy of Governor Holmes to select the best men and women available for state positions. — that he has carried out this policy has been demonstrated by the caliber of the appointment he has made.

Governor 'Technically' Violated His Authority

Very definitely, the governor flouted the intent of the law in appointing a Democrat to replace Bob Stults as D.A. His denial in Tuesday's News-Review shows that he has been hit in a tender spot. New Labor Dispute Looms In Portland Over Attempt To Organize Bank Workers

WASHINGTON — The city of Portland, Ore.—now busy cleaning up labor scandals aired before Senate racketeers investigators—has another labor situation on its hands that could draw some national attention.

This involves a union organizing campaign among several hundred employees of the Portland branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco.

There is talk of a strike, and if that happens, the case is likely to wind up in the courts.

Under the Taft-Hartley Law the managements of Federal Reserve Banks are specifically exempt from the requirement of bargaining with their employees, although there seems to be nothing to prevent them if they choose.

The T-H law also prohibits individuals employed by the United States government or any of its agencies from participating in a labor strike. Federal Reserve banks are owned partly by the government and partly by private member banks.

The Office Employees International Union claims it has organized the "overwhelming majority" of the Portland Federal Reserve's employees, but that the

Youth Sometimes More Grown Up Than Adults

To the Editor — First I want to fully understand that this correspondence is not fuel for any conflict in the community — school problem in Camas Valley. You say in your editorial that the juvenile and despicable act of hanging and burning of effigies was an expression of resentment in the Camas Valley school. This I question! Since my only information as to the emotional display was hearsay I can not say, "It was done by," but my understanding of the youth of our school is conclusive proof to me that youth alone is not responsible for this act and that many forces outside of the Camas Valley school were brought to bear.

Once again, I must say the anonymous letter you have announced receiving purportedly from "Most of the Students of Camas Valley High School" is to me a word of mouth item. I do know that any action taken by the youth of our community may have lacked the form to be accepted, but if you know these young people you could not call them cowards. A rational and logic solution to school problems are often reached by the deliberation of the student council of our school. Individuals express themselves then act in accord with the wishes of the group. What improvement can be made for successful social living? Is it possible the young adults of our school correctly evaluated the results of the group meetings of the adults in our community and knew them to be wrong? Do we as adults sometimes pass judgement without complete details?

Thank you for your time and know that this is in no way a personal criticism. While we as individuals may differ in opinion as to the ability to choose and write on subjects so vital to America.

Roseburg Ministerial Assn.

The day following the crucifixion of Jesus must have been very dark and drear to his followers. We read in Luke's Gospel, "The whole crowd that had collected for the spectacle, when they saw what had happened, went home in bitter grief."

To most of the followers of Jesus, this represented the end of their hopes and desires. Their master had been put to death as a common criminal. One cannot help but sense their feeling of despair as they read the stories of the death of Jesus in the Gospels.

The small group of disciples now became marked men. Their leader had been treated as a criminal and, now, they too came under suspicion.

They were afraid! Of all of the crowds that had followed him and of all the disciples who had pledged their undying devotion and support to him, we read that only Mary of Magdala, Mary the mother of James and Joseph, and the

mother of the sons of Zebedee were obviously present at the time of the crucifixion. It must indeed have been a sad day for the followers of Jesus.

We know, however, that the story does not end with sadness and bitter disappointment. These same men who, following the crucifixion were so bitterly disappointed and afraid, were soon to turn the entire known world of that day upside down with a message of hope and joy. Jesus the Christ arose from the dead. God had triumphed over the grave!

What Jesus had told them would happen really was true. God could not be bound by the grave. With the awareness of the truth of this enthusiasm, these men had a message and they wanted the entire world to share with them in the glorious truth of that message.

Today, 1957, the message of Easter is still the same: Christ is risen from the dead. God has finally and completely conquered the grave. With this message, the early disciples literally turned the world upside down. The message of the Risen Christ is timeless and we of the ministerial association hope that your hearts have been warmed by the Risen Christ and that you too will feel the freshness and the vitality of this Easter season.

To this writer, one of the most beautiful expressions of the Easter story is to be found in the 24th chapter of the Gospel of Luke. This is the story of the walk to Emmaus. Won't you plan to read it sometime on Easter Day?
