Roseburg stayed hard in the running in the District 5 A-1 baseball chase with a twin-bill split with Springfield Tuesday at Finlay Field, but Eugene swept into first place, unbeaten after taking a doubleheader from the North Bend Bulldogs.

The Indians shut out Springfield 4-0 in the five-inning second game after losing the seven-inning opener, 3-1. Eugene won games of 5-4 and 9-2 over North Bend.

In a pair of close District 5 A-1 baseball games played at Finlay Field Tuesday, Roseburg and Springfield split a doubleheader.

The Millers took the opener, 3-1, and Roseburg, behind the four-hit pitching of Ron Beamer, taking the second one, 4-0.

In the second game of the day, Roseburg jumped off to a one-run lead at the end of the first inning as Don Wells, the first Roseburg batter of the game, walked. Bill Oerding, the next batter, also walked and advanced to third as Jim Brown doubled Wells home with the first run.

Oerding was out trying to steal home on an attempted squeeze play to end the threat.

Retires Six
In the bottom of the second and third innings, Herman, who had replaced Palermo on the mound for Springfield, held the Indians without a hit or a run as he retired six men in order.

The fourth inning was the big inning for the Indians as Beamer, the first batter of the inning, lined a single to center and went to second on Brown's walk. Both runners were then driven home on a towering triple to center by catcher Ed LaRoque. LaRoque then scored on a ground out by Meredith.

LaRoque with his triple and Brown with his double were the top sluggers for Roseburg, while Wendel with 2-2, both singles, led Springfield.

The first game of the afternoon was close from the word "go" as the Indians, out for their third straight win in league action, faltered and dropped the close 3-1 decision.

Oerding Homers
Roseburg opened the scoring in the first inning as Oerding, the third batter in the inning for the Indians, slammed a long home run over the right fielder's head to be the only Indian run of the game.

Springfield bounced back in the top of the second inning with a pair of runs of its own as the first batter, Harper, singled into left field for the second Miller hit of the game. Wendel, the next batter, was safe on a fielder's choice as Oerding attempted to force the runner at second, but the throw was too late.

After the next two Miller players were easy outs, Prociw, the winning pitcher, singled into center scoring both runners. Willis then singled into right for the third Springfield hit of the inning, but was picked off first base by Oerding for the third out.

The Millers added another run in the top of the third on errors by Dick Meredith, Tom Burgess and Mike Hatfield to account for all the Springfield runs.
