LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — This Ohio River city went on its annual pre-Kentucky Derby festive binge today with one ear cocked toward Churchill Downs, where 10 finely tuned 3-year-old horses awaited the call.

Nine of the 10 were as ready as man could make them for the 1 1/4-mile race over the Downs starting at 4:30 p.m. EST tomorrow before some 100,000 fans and a national television audience.

But the tenth, Calumet Farm's hard-running Gen. Duke, was the talk of the natives as well as the out-of-towners.

Will Gen. Duke start against the greatest field ever to contest this race? It was a question that not even trainer Jimmy Jones could answer today.

"We may not know until an hour before post time," said Jones of his star who was sidelined with a bruised left front foot Tuesday after finishing second to Clifford Lusk's Federal Hill in the Derby Trial.
