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Bevos Tag Coen With 5-0 Defeat As Teams Split Doubleheader

Los Angeles held a one game lead in the Pacific Coast League Monday, thanks to two tightly pitched victories and the power-packed bat of Steve Bilko.

The Angels, defending PCL champs, stand a good chance of holding their lead for a bit, since they play their next series against the last place Portland Beavers, starting Tuesday.

San Diego and Vancouver furnish the only league action Monday — finishing a game called in the sixth inning because of a Vancouver curfew and then going on to the only scheduled league game.

The Angels moved to the top Sunday by dropping Hollywood, 2-0 and 11-1.

San Diego won the first game against third place Vancouver, 9-7, but was behind 1-0 when the second game was postponed.

San Francisco split with second spot Seattle, winning the first by 8-3 and then losing, 3-2.

Sacramento beat Portland, 5-2, and then lost, 5-0.

Red Adams, backed by Steve Bilko's two-run homer, blanked the Stars for Los Angeles in the first game. The Angels won the second as pitcher Bob Darnell held Hollywood to five hits.

Bilko's homer in the sixth with Jim Bakes aboard broke up a pitching duel between Adams and Bob Garber of the Stars. It was the sixth homer of the season for Bilko.

The second Hollywood-Los Angeles game was played under protest by the Stars after the umpires reversed a decision in the fourth. They first ruled that Wally Lammers was tagged out on a rundown between third and home but after a huddle allowed him to go back to third, saying his base path had been blocked by Leo Rodriguez.

Stu Locklin drove in five runs with two doubles and two singles for San Diego. The only score of the called second game came when Cal Seigrist singled, went to second on a wild pitch, took third on a single and scored on an infield out.

A three-run first inning gave the Rainiers all the scores they needed to down San Francisco. Leo Kiely, who replaced Bert Theil for the Stars in the second, pitched perfect ball for the rest of the seven-inning game, but his mates couldn't close the gap. In the first game, the Stars took a commanding lead with three runs in the fourth and led it with Marty Keough's three-run homer in the ninth.

Portland shut out Sacramento in the nightcap behind the three-hit pitching of Bill Werle. Sacramento captured the first as Cuno Barragan homered in the ninth. Saturday, Los Angeles beat Hollywood, 3-3; San Diego dropped Vancouver, 8-6; Seattle defeated San Francisco, 5-1; and Sacramento outscored Portland, 15-6.

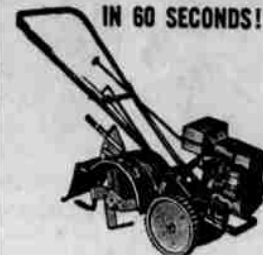
Win Track Meets
