Shoe Banned For 15 Days

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — One of the biggest misuses in racing history has cost jockey Willie Shoemaker a 15-day suspension.

Churchill Downs suspended Shoemaker yesterday for "gross carelessness" in misjudging the finish line in last Saturday's third running of the Kentucky Derby.

Shoemaker's mount, Gallant Fox, finished second in a photo finish to Calumet Farm's Iron Liege.

After the race, Shoemaker said he mistook the 18th pole for the finish line and eased up on his mount.

Officials at the Downs said their authority is limited to Kentucky, but, normally all American tracks will honor the suspension, which goes into effect tomorrow.

Shoemaker agreed the action will keep him out of the Preakness at Baltimore's Pimlico track May 18. He added he had been assigned to ride Gallant Fox in that race.

MOOSE LED MICKY

NEW YORK (AP) — Bill (Moose) Skowron, first baseman for the New York Yankees, led the world champions in hitting during the exhibition games with a .330 mark. He had 21 hits in 60 trips to the plate.

Mickey Mantle finished second with 20 hits in 62 trips for a .323 mark. Mantle led the team in home runs with seven. In the final exhibition, third baseman Andy Carey moved into the .300 bracket. He batted .304 with 21 hits in 69 efforts. Catcher Yogi Berra was fourth in hitting with .293.

U. S., British Attaches Victims Of Czech Trick

VIENNA, Austria (AP) — The U.S. embassy in Prague says Czechoslovak police detained U.S. and British air attaches up a side road to frame them on a charge of approaching "important military installations."

The American and British embassies in Prague protested the seizure Friday of the attaches, U.S. Col. Daniel Teberg of Crystal Lake, Ill., and British Col. Cedric Masterson. They were held three hours.

The Czech government sent protest notes to the United States and Britain, claiming direct violation of the officers' duties and privileges.

There was no demand for their recall home, however, and the Czechs indicated their notes were intended as a "warning."

The U.S. embassy gave this account of the incident:

The two officers were driving near the Czech town of Nymburk when military police flagged them and sent them down a side road. The attaches saw no signs marking a restricted zone but Czech army guards stopped them.

The officers identified themselves as diplomatic personnel but got no answer to their inquiries of why they had been detained and were being held.

The Czech Communists have been reporting numerous spy arrests in recent weeks, apparently to stir up anti-Western sentiment in advance of the May 19 national elections.

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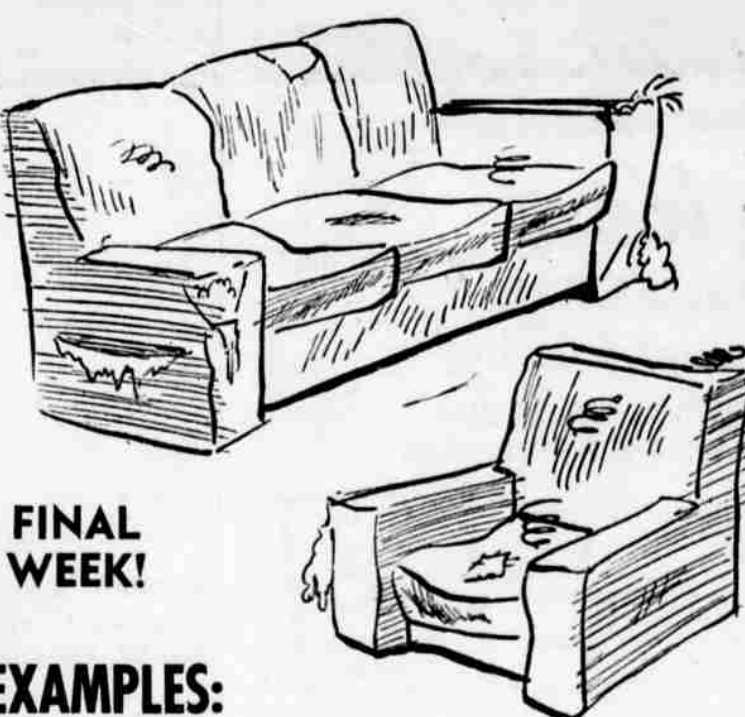
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
