Roseburg in second place with a 6-4 record against Eugene's 9-1, has to win both games in order to have at least a chance for district honors.

Beamer Starts
Ron Beamer, hard throwing lefty will start the seven-inning first game for the Indians and Bill Oerding will go in the five-inning nightcap.

For Eugene, in the first game it will be Gary Ashworth and in the second game Lynn Coons on the mound with Bert Clausen behind the plate.

Slated to start at first base for Roseburg will be either Beamer or Oerding, depending on who pitches. At second base will be Tom Burgess with Rod Hoensch at third and Don Wells at short.

In the outfield, Jim Brown will be in left, Paul Hanson in center and Jerry Anderson in right.

At first base for Eugene will be Don Lawrence with Tom Jones at second, Russ Diehl at third and Charlie Warren in right.

In the outfield, John Polhemus will start in left, Ken Tuttle in center and either Coons or Ashworth in right.

Eugene, which is fresh from a double victory over North Bend will be out to nab their third and fourth victories of the season over the Indians and victory number 11 and 12 for the year.

Eugene, Marshfield Favored Trackmen In District Meet;

The high flying Marshfield Pirates, fresh from the southern sub-district 5-A-1 scoring title with a total of 66½ points will bring its track team, 21 strong, into Eugene Saturday to compete against Roseburg and North Bend, from the southern half and Eugene, Cottage Grove and Springfield from the northern half in the annual District 5-A-1 track meet.

Eugene, winner of the northern part with a total of 73 5-6 points against 48 5-6 for Cottage Grove and 27 1-3 for Springfield, ranks as the favorite on the basis of holding six of the best individual times that were turned in in the sub-district meets.

Roseburg, second top qualifier in the southern part, with 15 boys in 21 events will have an entry in each of the 14 events.

Boys from Roseburg who will take part in the district meet include Marvin Fray in the high hurdles broad jump, and 220-yard dash; Jerry Humphries in the 100-yard dash; Gary Sanders in the mile run; Dave Bradley in the low hurdles, shot put and discus; Terry Travers in the 220-yard dash and high jump; Bill Sherwood in the 440-yard run; Roy Hedine in the 800 yard run; Brent Long in the shot put and Kerner Doughton in the 440.

Others are Bill Hager in the javelin, Fred Skeels in the broad jump and high jump, Doyle Cannon in the high jump and Gene Enclott, Bob Steel and Larry Fredrickson in the pole vault.

Roseburg's winning relay team of Terry Travers, Fred Skeels, Dave Bradley and Marvin Fray will also take part.

Second high scorer in the southern sub-district meet was North Bend which qualified 12 men in 17 events and a relay team.

Eugene leads all qualifying with 26 entries, Springfield qualified 19 and Cottage Grove qualified 18. All qualified relay teams.
