Roseburg, which could have stayed close in the race with a double win and one more Eugene loss, is almost out of the race, as they need four straight wins and Eugene needs three losses.

In action around the league on Friday, the Cottage Grove team nabbed a tie for third with Springfield by taking two games from North Bend 8-7 and 1-0.

In the make or break District 5-A-1 baseball games against the Eugene Axemen, the Roseburg Indians could do no more than split the two games played on Finlay Field Saturday.

The first game went to Roseburg, 4-1, behind the steady three-hit pitching of Ron Beamer and the second game to Eugene 3-1, as the Indians could find the slants of pitcher Don Lawrence for just one hit, a single by Don Wells in the fifth inning.

Oerding Triples

The first game of the day was Roseburg all the way with Bill Oerding first batter of the game for Roseburg, slamming a long triple to right field and then scoring when the right fielder let the ball go through him on the relay throw.

Paul Hanson, the next batter was safe on an error by the second baseman followed by two straight errors by pitcher Gary Ashworth on easy grounders to the mound by Beamer and Ed LaRoque. On the second error, Hanson scored the second run of the inning.

Don Wells was safe on a fielder's choice as LaRoque was out at second. After Jerry Anderson had a struck out for the second out, Jim Brown drove the ball deep into left field and the left fielder misjudged the ball and let it slip through his fingers and Beamer and Wells scampered home with run number three and four of the inning.

Five Errors

Eugene had opened the scoring in the top of the first inning on walk to Jim Stout and singles by Lawrence and Charlie Warren that gave them a short 1-0 lead before Roseburg broke the game open in the bottom of the first.

Pitcher Ashworth for Eugene allowed the Indians just two hits, but six errors in the field, five of them in the first inning, lost the game for him.

Oerding with his triple was the only batter with an extra base hit in the game.

In the fast action, arguments marked both games but the Indians could not come up with a base hit when it counted and bowed to the Axemen 3-1.

Eugene scored first in the fifth inning game on two second inning runs. The second batter of the inning, Ken Tuttle reached first on an error by Tom Burgess at second and Lynn Coons walked as next man up.

Tom Jones then slammed a triple to left that scored both Tuttle and Coons, but Jones died on third as Oerding settled down and got

Oakridge Takes 5-A-2 Toga; Drain's Paul Reel Qualifies

Oakridge, swept to the District 5-A-2 track title at Springfield Saturday in a meet that saw 11 new records set in the 14 events.

The high flying Oakridge squad scored a total of 166 2-3 points against runner-up Willamette's 78 and placed 15 boys in the state A-2 meet in 12 different events. Willamette will have five entries in five events, Elmira four in four, Junction City three in three and Drain one in one. St. Francis and Pleasant Hill failed to place a man in the state meet that will be held Saturday in Corvallis.

Drain, Douglas County's entrant had one qualifier in Paul Reel in the Discus throw but had points from nine boys in their total of 41 1/2 points.

Reel with a throw of 125-6 in the discus placed second behind the winning toss of Marion Elder of Willamette's 128-9 throw.

Other Drain points were gathered by Reel with a fourth in the pole vault on a jump of 10-6 and a third in the shot put with a heave of 41-6, by Dennis Hoss in the mile with a fourth in the time of 4:59, by Stan Carter with a fifth in the 880-yard run in the time of 2:12, by Jerry Nash with a fourth in the discus with a toss of 123-0.

Bob Seaton placed third in the javelin with a toss of 148-0 and the relay team placed third to account for all the points.

Eugene Leads In 5-A-1 Track Meet; Locals 5th Indians Blanked In Qualifying; Three Local Records Smashed

Eugene High School reigns as new king of District 5-A-1 track, replacing Cottage Grove as they rolled up a total of 128 5-6 points in the six-team meet held at Eugene Saturday.

In second place with 92 5-6 points was Cottage Grove followed by Marshfield with 74 1-3, North Bend 55, Roseburg 44 and Springfield 39.

In qualifying entrants for next week's state meet at Corvallis, Eugene placed 10 men in five events, Cottage Grove seven in four events, Marshfield four in four, North Bend three in three and Springfield three in three. Roseburg was blanked of any state qualifiers.

Local Blanked
Although the Indians did not place a man in the state meet Saturday they ran up a total of 44 points in nine events.

Fred Skeels of Roseburg was the top point-getter for the Indians with a pair of thirds in the high jump on a leap of 5-10 and in the broad jump with a jump of 19-5 1/2.

Other thirds were taken by Bill Hager in the javelin with a toss of 174-6, which is a new school record for Roseburg, and by the relay team of Dave Bradley, Terry Travers, Marvin Fray and Skeels. They ran the relay in the time of 1:35.7 which is a better time than they have had all year.

Other points were picked up by Marvin Fray with a fourth in the high hurdles in the time of 13.9, a fifth in the broad jump with a jump of 19-0 1/2 and a fifth in the 230-yard run in the time of 24.0.

Doyle Cannon also had a fourth in the high jump with 5-9. Gary Sanders a sixth in the mile at 4:43. Jerry Humphries a sixth in the 100-yard dash in the time of 11.9, and Travers a sixth in the 230 in the time of 24.3.

McGaughy's Mark Bettered
Double winners for the day included Larry Senn in the 100 and 230-yard dashes and Doyol Burlison in the 880-yard run and the mile run.

Four new records were posted in the course of the day, two of them breaking old Roseburg records.

Burlison was the breaker in two of them, the 880 which was run in the time of 2:00.2 by Burlison broke the old record of 2:01.5 set by Sam McGaughy of Roseburg in 1934. His time of 4:25.2 in the mile broke the old record of 4:27.4 set by Mark Robbins of Roseburg in 1935.

Other record breakers were by Bob Holstrom of Eugene in the pole vault with a leap of 12-4 1/2 and by Hardy Spurgeon of Marshfield in the javelin with a toss of 191-11 breaking the record of 175-2 set by Bill Henderson of Drain in 1935.

High point man for the day was Senn with total of 22 points fol-

lowed by Ernie Rollison of Cottage Grove with 20 1/2. Burlison with 20 and Spurgeon with 19.

The top two men in each event are eligible for the state meet.

Joseph Lane Pioneers Dominate All-County Track Meet Saturday

Joseph Lane Junior High school walked away with the team honors at the first annual Douglas County junior high school track meet in both the seventh and eighth grade events in a county wide meet held Saturday on the Roseburg High School oval.

Joseph Lane nabbed 43 1/2 points in the eighth grade events and came in first ahead of Sutherland with 25, Central with 19, Douglas with 15, Camas Valley with three and Riddle with 2 1/2.

In the seventh grade events, Joseph Lane had 38 points, Central 18, Riddle 15, Sutherland 11, Tiller-Drew four, Myrtle Creek three, and Camas Valley two.

Russ Harte of Sutherland and Ted Green of Douglas were the double winners in the eighth grade action. Harte took firsts in the 75 and 150-yard dashes and Green had firsts in the broad jump and high jump.

For the seventh graders, Earl Dixon of Joseph Lane had three firsts in the 75-yard dash, 150-yard dash and the broad jump. Bill Brothers also of Joseph Lane took two firsts in the 660-yard run and the pole vault.

Seven of the ten schools that were invited attended the affair in which about 150 boys participated.

For a fourth straight year, Canyonville's Tigers have won the District 4-B track title, taking Saturday's district meet at Myrtle Creek with 77 points.

They won the close meet by out-scoring Powers which had 66 1/2 points and a host of Douglas County schools. Days Creek was third with 59 1/2 points, Yoncalla fourth with 55, Camas Valley had 49, Canyonville Bible Academy 47, Gold Beach 39, Elkton 28 and Riddle 11.

The Tigers led qualifying for the state meet by placing four men in six events and a relay team. Qualifiers included the top two men in each event and the top two relay teams.

Three new records were set in the meet.

Yoncalla's Everett Swezey set a new javelin mark with a toss of 173-8, Elkton's Dick Johnson went 20-8 1/2 to rewrite the broad jump mark and Powers' Frank Smith ran the 220 in 23.5 to beat an old mark set by Canyonville's Bill Hoffer and Addeberger of Pleasant Hill in 1952 and 1951.

Elkton's Johnson, defending state high hurdles champion, won his speciality in usual style Saturday and also made the grade for the state meet with his broad jump first and his second in the low hurdles.

Hillstrom, a former Marshfield High School star, will be graduated at Oregon in June. He is currently doing practice teaching in the Eugene schools.

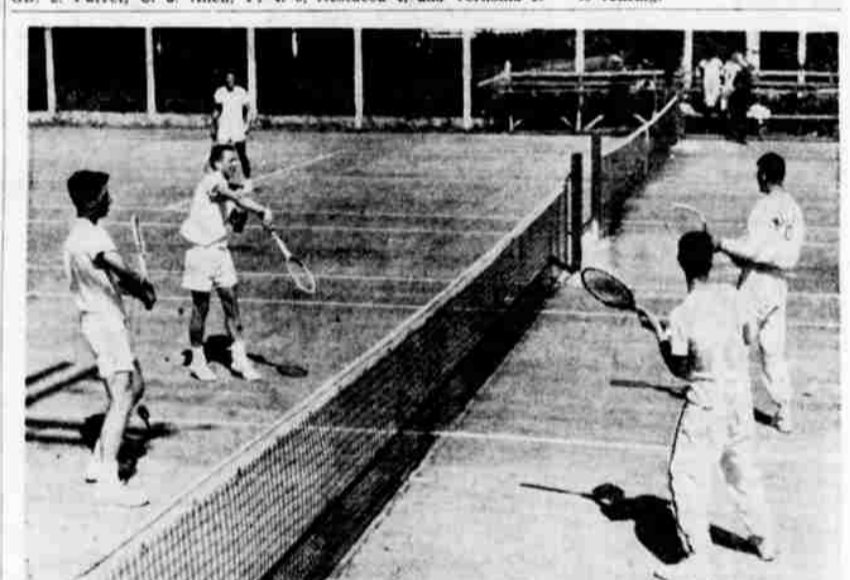
Irvin Quits Baseball

The Roseburg Indians, host to the District Six tennis tournament Saturday came through with a district champ in Fred McKeen in singles and runner-ups in Dick Ramberg and Keith Eddy in the doubles. The matches were held on the high school and VA courts.

First round action found Carl Thiel of Roseburg bowing to Bob Semon of Springfield and Dave Montgomery of Roseburg falling before Don Semon of Springfield. Fred McKeen dropped John Quinby of Eugene also in the first round 6-1, 6-1.

In the first round doubles Bill Kelly and Brady Montgomery of Roseburg defeated Met Wilson and John Gould of Eugene in three sets 6-3, 1-6, 7-5 and Dick Ramberg and Keith Eddy drew a bye.

Semi-final rounds saw Fred McKeen drop Don Semon 61, 6-4 to advance in the final round of singles and Ramberg and Eddy beat Jim Taylor and Paul Kambley of Eugene and advanced to the final round in doubles action.
