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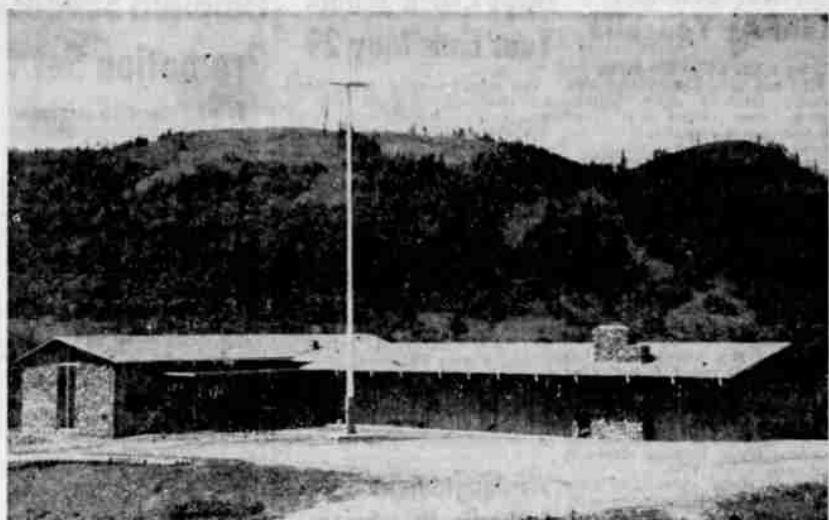

The dedication of the Tri-City Presbyterian Church will be held Sunday at 3 p.m., and the public is invited to the formal dedication ceremonies.

Delivering the words of Peace and Praise will be the Rev. J. Alfred Marquand of Grants Pass. A solo, "Open the Gates of the Temple," will be sung by the Rev. Wayne Wattman of Glendale. The Rev. John Edward Adams of Roseburg will give the word from the scripture. The blessing will be given by the Rev. Homer Noble of Oakland. Mr. Carl Palo, building chairman will present the church for dedication. The Rev. Oscar Payne of Coos Bay will give the speech of acceptance. The words of dedication will be given by the local pastor, the Rev. J. Elbert Nash. Dedication prayer will be by the Rev. Norman Tully of Central Point. Greetings will be given by Oscar Payne and Al Neet of Myrtle Creek, and George Flanagan and the Rev. Alfred Marquand. The dedication sermon will be delivered by the Rev. G. Henry Green of Portland.

Ned Norton of Myrtle Creek was the architect and builder of the church, which is finished in natural cedar siding and the fireplace and gable ends were constructed of rock from the Umpqua River. The landscape is dominated by a 50 ft. cross.
