Migratory Farm Labor Problem To Be Studied
SALEM — An interim committee study of migratory farm labor problems would be provided by a resolution passed by the Senate Saturday and sent to the House.
Sen. Anthony Yturri (R), of Ontario, said the committee is needed to see that the 30,000 to 75,000 migrants in Oregon are treated properly, that they have good housing, and that they don't bring communicable diseases with them.
He said conditions in a few farm labor camps are horrible.

Ex-Roseburg Residents Visit Roseburg Church Where They Wed In '94
Sixty-three years ago Frank S. Godfrey, a young bank employee in Roseburg, was attending the First Methodist Church, of which he was a member.
The usher seated beside him a young lady, with whom he shared his hymn book. Following the service, he learned that her name was Hattie Berry and that she had arrived in Roseburg only the night before from Stillwater, Minn. On Oct. 15, 1894, they walked down the aisle of the church to become man and wife.
Last Sunday, Mr. and Mrs. Godfrey sat in a pew in the Roseburg Methodist church on the anniversary of that memorable meeting. They came to Roseburg Saturday and renewed acquaintance with a few of the old friends still remaining.
Godfrey came to Roseburg from his native Michigan in 1896 and found employment with the Douglas County Bank, of which he became cashier, prior to his departure in the early 1900s. After leaving Roseburg he engaged in successful ventures at Seaside and Portland. He is widely known for his ability as a toastmaster and after-dinner speaker.
He is a veteran of the Spanish-American War, in which he served as quartermaster sergeant with the Roseburg unit, Co. B, 2nd Oregon Infantry.
Mr. and Mrs. Godfrey, who reside at 3863 N.E. 75th Ave., Portland, were accompanied to Roseburg by their son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Fred Otto, Portland. Their family includes three grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

Senate Passes Cut-Down Commerce Dept. Bill
WASHINGTON — The Senate Friday passed a \$613,584,290 Commerce Department appropriations bill, cut \$257,928,710 or 29 per cent below President Eisenhower's budget.
But 65 million dollars of the cut was more apparent than real since the bill allowed a transfer of that sum from an old appropriation.
Sen. Holland (D-Fla), floor manager for the measure, pointed out that there was a reduction of 22 per cent below the budget not counting the 65 million in the cuts. He said this was the biggest cut on this bill in the 11 years he has been in Congress.
