Ingrid Denies Rift As Scandal Smears Rossellini

PARIS (AP)—Actress Ingrid Bergman Monday said "there is no truth at all" to a report that her husband, director Roberto Rossellini, is living with a married Indian woman in Bombay and plans to divorce Miss Bergman.

"I wish they would leave my husband in peace to do his work," said Miss Bergman, who is acting on the Paris stage. "This is all a rumor that has sprung up and it is truly unfortunate."

Rossellini is now making a picture in India. Miss Bergman has repeatedly denied rumors of a rift between them.

A copyrighted news dispatch from Bombay said Rossellini's paramour is the beautiful, 27-year-old mother of two small children.

The dispatch said the woman is reported to be pregnant, as Miss Bergman was almost eight years ago when her affairs with Rossellini made worldwide headlines.

The news said reliable sources in Bombay reported the Indian government had asked Rossellini to leave India because of the affair, but that an Italian embassy spokesman said India so far had only asked the director unofficially to "try to smooth down the trouble to avoid any scandal."

Bullfrog Wins \$1,000 For Owner

ANGELS CAMP, Calif. (AP)—The new world champion jumping frog is a San Joaquin Delta bullfrog named Beans.

Owned and trained by 15-year-old Caroline Voitch, Stockton, Beans spanned 12 feet, 7 inches in his three allotted hops Sunday and won the 31st annual jumping frog jubilee.

The contest commemorates Mark Twain's famous yard, "The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County."

Beans got the glory. Miss Voitch gets \$1,000.

But his performance was far short of the world record of 16 feet 19 inches set in 1934 by a frog named Lucky, owned by Ray Weiner of Angels Camp.

While domestic hoppers turned in mediocre performances, the foreign frogs appeared demoralized. Most of them just sat.

Japan Okays Joint Defense With America

TOKYO (AP)—Japan's government has approved a four-point basic defense policy tied securely to the United States "until an effective organ of the United Nations can be set up" to combat possible future aggression.

"In case of aggression, Japan will fight it in order to preserve our country's independence and peace, which is based on democratic principle," said the government announcement of the policy approved by Prime Minister Kishi's Cabinet.

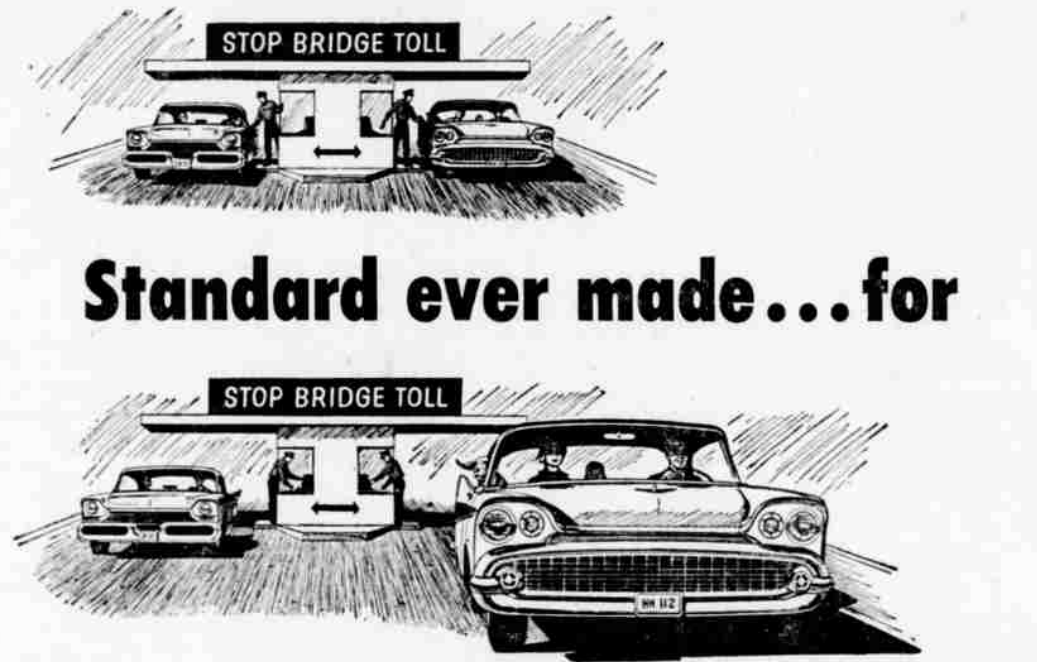
Threats To Witnesses Defer Blinding Trial
