Bodies To Stay On Mountainside
 CHILLIWACK, B. C. — The perilous, almost vertical face of Mt. Slesse will continue at least temporarily, as the resting place for 62 persons killed in a Canadian airline crash last December. Officials have decided it would be too hazardous to try to bring down the remains now and that the risk might be too great even in the summer.
 At an inquest Wednesday night, H. W. Seagrin, a Trans-Canada Airlines vice president, suggested that a mid-summer mass service "be considered as the most practical approach to a most difficult and most thoroughly examined problem."
 Coroner Glen McDonald agreed with the suggestion and also proposed that a 300-square mile area around the rugged 8,000-foot peak be closed off from the public to prevent any looting or tampering with the wreckage.
 Relatives have reported that a Chinese passenger from the plane was carrying \$80,000 in a money belt.



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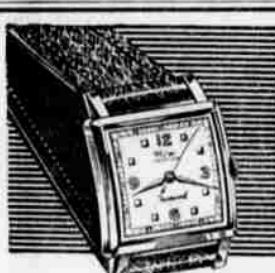
