Disaster, Famine Offering Slated For Adventists

A special disaster and famine relief offering will be taken in the Roseburg Seventh-day Adventist Church, at the morning worship service Saturday, when members will endeavor to bring a substantial offering for the relief of disaster and famine victims here in our own country as well as abroad.

On a denomination-wide basis, some \$250,000 is expected to be turned in during the general drive for added relief support.

This amount is but a supplement to the denomination's total fund, however, according to Elder W. R. Riston, church pastor. In 1956, cash and supplies valued at more than \$8,000,000 were distributed in 20 different countries affected by famine and disaster, he reported.

Supplies included 170,000 pounds of food and 330,000 pounds of processed clothing. In addition, 6,026,000 hours of labor were contributed by church members, the pastor said. The Roseburg church has helped in this work through its Dorcas welfare group, with Mrs. Gilbert Wood, leader.

Dismissals Sought For Indictments In Vice Inquiry

PORTLAND — Teamster officials Clyde Crosby, Lew Cornelius and Frank Malloy and former Dist. Atty. William Langley are seeking dismissal of a number of indictments against them in the vice investigation here.

In motions filed in state circuit court Wednesday Langley seeks dismissal of seven charges, Crosby of three and Cornelius and Malloy one each.

They cite a variety of grounds, including arguments that the indictments were not endorsed properly, witnesses were not listed properly and that an accompanying report by the grand jury obstructs justice because it was "based on recitals of scandalous, misleading and defamatory material."

Langley, who was ousted from office recently after being convicted on a charge of failing to prosecute gamblers, asked dismissal of charges that he conspired to obtain false testimony;

conspired to receive a bribe and was delinquent in office.

Crosby, Teamster international representative in Oregon, seeks dismissal of charges of perjury; of conspiring to copy wiretap information and of copying wiretap information. Those last charges involve tape recordings seized by police in a raid on the home of Raymond Clark, an employee of

Big Jim Elkins, last May. Crosby was accused of copying the recordings. The seized tape recordings were used in evidence in the recent U. S. District Court trial in which Elkins and Clark were convicted of wiretapping.

Cornelius and Malloy, officials in Portland Teamster locals, are asking dismissal of a charge of perjury against each.

PENANCE, England — Mayflower II radioed Thursday she had sailed out of the Sargasso Sea and into the westbound north equatorial current.

He has been appointed, at an undisclosed salary, to succeed Dr. Norton Crowe, who had been

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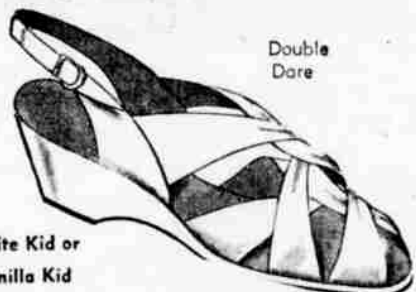
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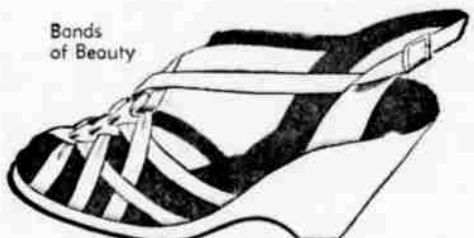
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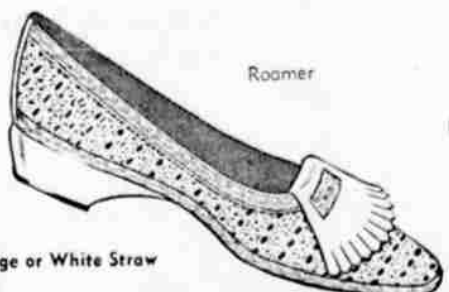
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Rebel Hungarian Leader Draws Death Sentence

BUDAPEST — Hungary's Communist government Thursday announced that Agoston Praszmay, who fought at the side of rebel leader Maj. Gen. Pal Malter in the anti-Russian revolt last fall, has been sentenced to death.

It was the fourth death sentence announced in the last 24 hours. This brought to 78 the officially announced death sentences passed by the Communist regime after the Russian army restored it to power.

The government has said also that 38 "counter-revolutionaries" have been executed. Unofficial estimates have placed the totals considerably higher.
