

Olson, Maxim Match Slated

PORTLAND — A comeback attempt is planned this summer by former middleweight champion Carl (Bobo) Olson, who for the past year has been working in a night club in nearby Vancouver, Wash.

Promoter Tommy Moyer disclosed Saturday that Olson would come out of retirement to take on Joey Maxim in a 10-round fight here July 18.

Olson, who hung up his gloves after two knockouts at the hands of Sugar Ray Robinson, has a record of 65 wins and 9 losses. Maxim's record is 82-25, with 4 draws.

UBC, OSC Crews Win First Willamette Race

SALEM — The University of British Columbia varsity and the Oregon State lightweights were the winners Saturday of the first crew races ever held on the Willamette River here.

Plans for inviting Washington, Stanford and California to join in the competition next year were disclosed after the race by the Salem Yacht and Boat Club, which sponsored the event.

The British Columbia varsity had a lead of 4 1/2 lengths as it crossed the finish line of the 1 1/4-mile course in 10:04 minutes. Oregon State's time was 10:28.

The OSC lightweights won by 6 1/2 lengths. They were timed at 9:29 minutes, and the Canadians at 10:06.

Riverside Boys, Fullerton Girls Win City Track Meet

Riverside Grade School walked away with top honors in the annual all-city track meet Saturday in the boys' division with a total of 127 points.

Wilbur School was second with 64 1/2 points, followed by Fullerton with 47 1/2, Green 36 1/2, Hucrest 31, Benson 22 1/2, Rose 19 1/2 and Melrose 8 1/2.

In the girls' division, Fullerton topped the field with a total of 82 points, with Riverside in second place with 78 and Wilbur in third with 64.

Benson was fourth with 49 1-3, followed by Hucrest with 32 1-3, Rose with 16, Green with 14 and Melrose with 8 1-3.

Division honors in the boys events in the middle division went to Riverside and Wilbur with 23 points. In the pee wee division, Riverside was away out in front with 40 points followed by Fullerton with 21 and Wilbur with 15.

Riverside Claims Victory

Riverside again was the winner in the lightweight division with a total of 35 points, followed by Green with 20 and Wilbur with 13. Wilbur was tops in the heavyweight division with 30 1/2 points, with Riverside second with 29 points and Benson third with 16 1/2.

Top honors in the middle division of the girls' events went to Fullerton and Wilbur with 21 points, followed by Riverside with 17. In the pee wee class, Wilbur topped the field with 23 points followed by Benson with 22 1/2 and Fullerton with 15.

In the lightweight class Riverside was high with 20 points followed by Fullerton with 16 and Hucrest with 15. Fullerton was high in the heavyweight division with 30 points, followed by Riverside with 24 and Benson with 10.

Score Double Wins

Double wins for the day in the boys' events went to Ken Walsh of Wilbur, in the Pee Wee class, with firsts in the 35 and 50-yard dashes.

Alvin Neal of Wilbur, a pair of firsts, one in the 75-yard dash and one in the shot put. Neal competed in the heavyweight division. Another double winner in the heavyweight class was Paul Brothers also from Wilbur, who had firsts in the 50-yard dash and a tie for first in the high jump.

Weston Wishart of Riverside was the only other double winner for the boys. Competing in the lightweight class, he took a first in the broad jump and tied for first in the high jump.

The girls' division did not have a double winner but Trudy Esselstrom nabbed three firsts in the heavyweight class. From Fullerton School, she took firsts in the 50 and 75-yard dashes and the broad jump.

Records Posted

Three new records were set by the girls during the day. The Riverside School shuttle relay team in the middle class, with a time of 23.5, broke the old record held by Rose of 23.7 that was set in 1951.

In the pee wee class, Wilbur School with a time of 26.0 in the 200-yard relay broke the old record of 29.1 set by Fullerton in 1953.

Trudy Esselstrom with a jump of 14-10 1/2 in the broad jump broke her own record of 13-5 set in 1954.

In the boys' divisions four new records were established. The Riverside shuttle relay team in the middle class, with a time of 22.2, broke the old record of 22.5 set by Fullerton in 1952. In the pee wee class, the 200-yard relay team from Riverside, with a time of 28.0, broke the old record of 28.4 set by Riverside in 1953.

Two records were established in the lightweight class. Wishart of Riverside, with a leap of 14-7 in the broad jump, broke the old record of 14-1 set by Baxter of Fullerton in 1954. Beamer of Green, with a heave of 28-1 in the shot put, broke the old record of 26-7 set by Johnson of Benson in 1950.
