OREGON STATE COLLEGE — Nineteen students from the Roseburg area will receive degrees June 3 at the 88th annual commencement exercises at Oregon State College.

They include from Roseburg — Elaine Frances Scudder, bachelor's degree in home economics; Barbara Ann Peterson, nursing education; Shirley Kocken, science; Charley Bardin Welton, William Robert Johnson, agriculture; Richard Lee Jacobson, Thomas Calvin Brody and Jayne Caroline Teague, business and technology; Roberta Lu Adams, Ernest Leroy Hooper, Donna Lee Deller and Ronald Joe Hicks, education.

From Riddle — Norman Ray Adsit and George Winfield Vaughn, engineering; Eric Daniel Jones and Kay Marie Season, science. William Theodore Schattenkerk of Winston, will receive a degree in agriculture and Donna Jean Henry of Glendale in business and technology.

Leonard William Riley III will receive a master of science degree. Oregon State will confer approximately 1235 degrees this year, including 25 doctor's degrees, 178 master's degrees, and some 1040 bachelor's degrees. The total is 150 more than 1956.

Graduation seniors represent 24 states, Alaska and Hawaii. The average age of men graduates this year is 24 and women 23. President A. L. Strand will confer the degrees and deliver his traditional class message.

The commencement exercises will be June 3 at 10 a.m. with baccalaureate service set for Sunday, June 2, at 11 a.m. Both programs will be held in the coliseum to provide maximum seating for parents, guests, and the general public.
