The boy awakened enough to tell him he lived on Southeast Stephens Street. When they got to the house, the boy remembered he had moved. Back they went to the youngster's home near the theater. None the worse for wear, the young man was ready to continue his sleep in bed at 2:30 a.m.

Roseburg Jersey Rated Tested Dam Distinction

A registered Jersey cow owned by Don Auer, Roseburg, Ore., has been rated a tested dam by the American Jersey Cattle Club. The distinction was awarded Sir Challenger Marie Anna for having three offspring with official production records.

The cow's progeny averaged 12-037 pounds of milk and 671 pounds of butterfat on a twice-daily milkings, 305-day mature equivalent basis. The records were made under one of the programs of official testing of the cattle club.

The tested dam rating aids Jersey owners in the selection of superior breeding stock. The three tested progeny required to qualify a cow as a tested dam may be either three tested daughters or three tested sons, or any combination totaling three.
