Lumber Price Index Shows Price Decline

PORTLAND — Crows Lumber Market News Service reported here that its index of lumber prices declined again in the two-week period ending May 31.
Threat of a strike in British Columbia mills has given standard and better green Douglas fir dimension some support. But lower grades have shown no signs of a pick up, the market letter said.
White fir dimension from western pine region mills is moving in good volume but prices have not picked up. Common grade Ponderosa pine boards in some widths and grades are softer due to seasonal appearance of air-dried stock.
Plywood sheathing was reported firm at \$105 to \$108. Sanded stock is firm at \$72 but production is strong.

Convention Draws Sutherlin Minister
