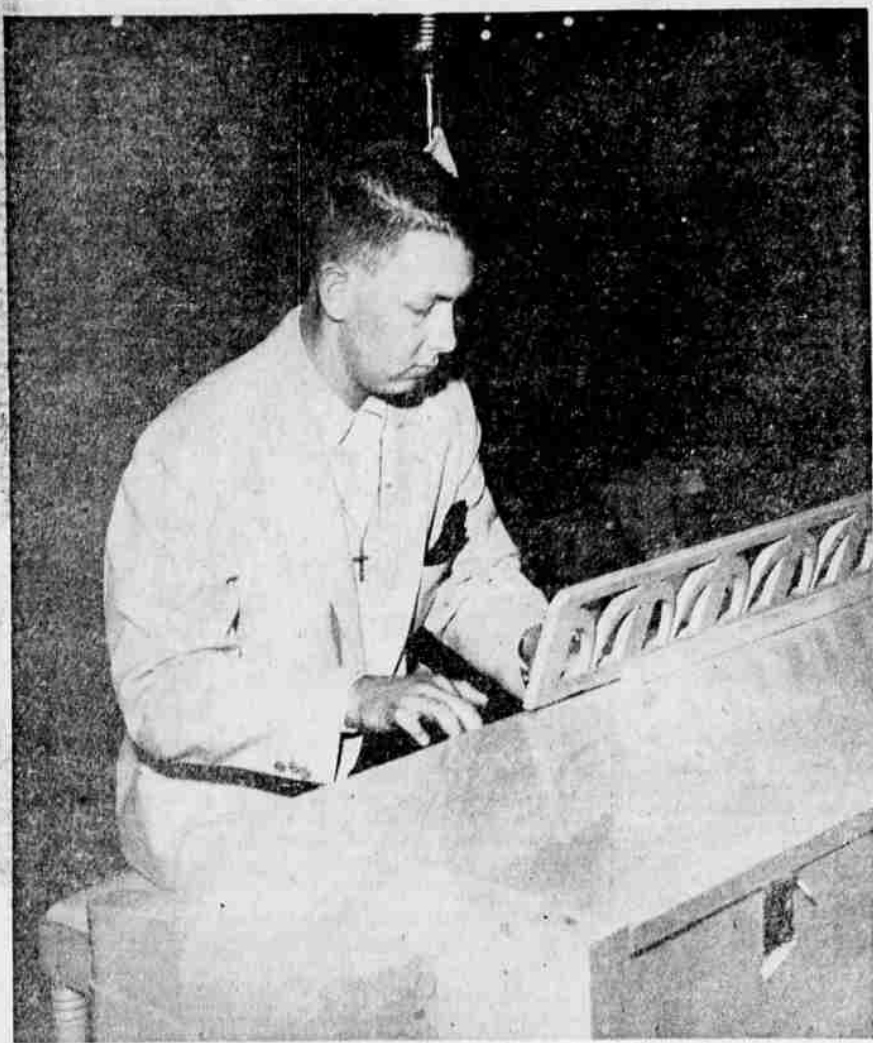

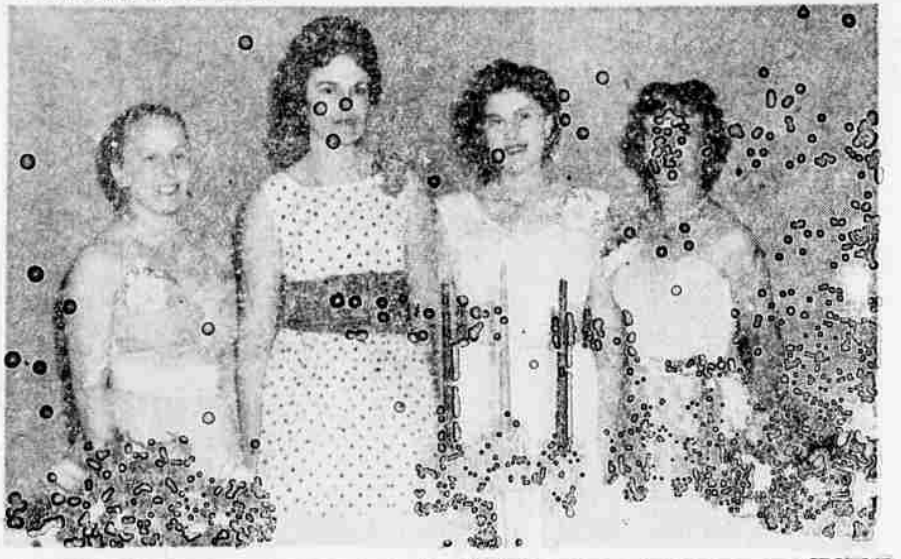
DENNIS KRUSE IS FETED AT RECENT PARTIES
