Bourges-Maunoury Billed For New French Premier

PARIS (AP) — Maurice Bourges-Maunoury, 42-year-old defense minister under Premier Guy Mollet, today was considered almost a cinch to succeed the Socialist leader as head of the French government.

The Radical-Socialist — which really means middle-roader-virtually means middle-roader-virtually a Socialist party caucus voted to participate in a Bourges-Maunoury coalition government. Several other parties, notably the Popular Re-

publican Movement, took a similar position.

PAYS FOR TURKEYS
PORTLAND (AP) — The state has paid \$8,466 to Max Lyons, Sauvier Island, whose turkey flock was destroyed last week on state's orders.

The destruction was ordered because of an outbreak of the disease, ornithosis, among the turkeys. Lyons had 2,827 birds in the flock.
