Tragic Crash To Be Probed

ROCKY FORD, Colo. — The violent death of 12 persons in a truck-train collision came under the scrutiny Wednesday of federal and state investigators.

The 12 were crushed to death when a crowded truck was demolished Tuesday by a 56-car Santa Fe freight train.

It was the worst road accident in Colorado history. Three other persons were injured critically. The truck was carrying 17 local residents to work in sugar beet fields.

In Washington, Chairman Owen Clarke of the Interstate Commerce Commission said the commission's bureau of railroad safety would investigate the tragedy. The Colorado Highway Patrol and the Colorado Public Utility Commission also were investigating.

The collision occurred on a private driveway into a farm yard six miles east of here.

Engineer W. S. Inskeep said he saw the truck stop at the crossing. The train, he said, was traveling at a speed of 40 m.p.h. when the truck suddenly started across the tracks in its path.

Leader Of Teamster Dissidents Is Delegate

SPOKANE — Jess Cumpston, the leader of a group of dissidents in Local 690 of the Teamsters Union, Tuesday night won election as a delegate to the union's international convention next fall.

Cumpston polled 48 votes to 35 by Albert J. Buhl, secretary of the local, for the last of four delegate berths. Other delegates selected were J. A. Whitney, recording secretary; and Oscar Upton and Ry Harrison, business agents.

Algerian Capital Back To Normal

ALGIERS — Algeria's capital was slowly returning to normal Wednesday after wild anti-Moslem rioting by an enraged French population which left at least 6 dead and 37 injured.

Those were the casualty figures announced by French authorities but other sources said at least 12 Arabs were killed and 40 other Moslems and Europeans were injured.

Police arrested at least 200 Frenchmen for taking part in the riots, which stemmed from anger over the bombing of a dance hall Sunday that killed eight French and wounded 83.

The rioting died out Tuesday night after French troops and police clamped a 9 p.m. curfew on the city. A mysterious fire broke out at midnight, destroying the ramshackle "flea market" on the edge of the city. No one was hurt. Also on the outskirts, a grenade exploded, injuring an old Arab man and a 5-year-old girl.
