

### Governor Holmes Signs Education, School Measures

SALEM (AP) — The Legislature's three main education bills and the measure paving the way for Oregon's centennial celebration in 1959 were signed into law Tuesday by Gov. Holmes.

The governor spent most of Tuesday signing bills at ceremonies attended by sponsors.

The three education bills are: HB466, increasing the basic school fund allotment to local districts from \$80 per census child per year to \$95; SB484, which changes the distribution formula for basic school aid in order to more nearly equalize educational costs; and HB162, which will compel many smaller districts to consolidate with larger districts.

The centennial bill, HB686, gives the Oregon Centennial Commission \$830,000 for the trade fair to be held in the summer of 1959 at the Pacific International Live-stock Exposition grounds in Portland. It will mark the 100th anniversary of Oregon's statehood. Invited to participate in the fair will be countries bordering the Pacific Ocean and the Northwest states.

Of the appropriation, \$500,000 will be used for new facilities at the P-I grounds.

The Centennial Commission hopes to repay the state the total amount of the appropriation.

Gov. Holmes also signed SB493, appropriating \$250,000 for the state's share of a new Salem armory; and SB495, appropriating \$100,000 for plans for a new Portland armory.

### Wholesale Food Prices Edge Slightly Higher

NEW YORK (AP) — Wholesale food prices edged higher this week, equalling the high for the year, Dun & Bradstreet reported Wednesday.

At \$6.22 the index compared with \$6.20 a week ago and was 1.3 per cent higher than \$6.14 a year ago. The figure matched the 1957 peak established during the week of March 26. The year's low point was \$6.08 May 14.

The index represents the total cost at wholesale of one pound each of 31 foods in general use. Lower were wheat, oats, barley, lard, cocoa and hogs.

### Columbia Spring Runoff Reached Record Heights

PORTLAND (AP) — The spring runoff of the Columbia River reached record proportions at eight stations along the river, U.S. Geological Survey engineers said Tuesday.

The flow at The Dalles was 153 per cent of the average for 1938-52, said Hollis Orem, engineer in charge.

He said ground water levels are mostly high in Washington and eastern Oregon, and low in southern Idaho and northern Oregon. For the Pacific Northwest as a whole, ground water levels are a little above average, he said.

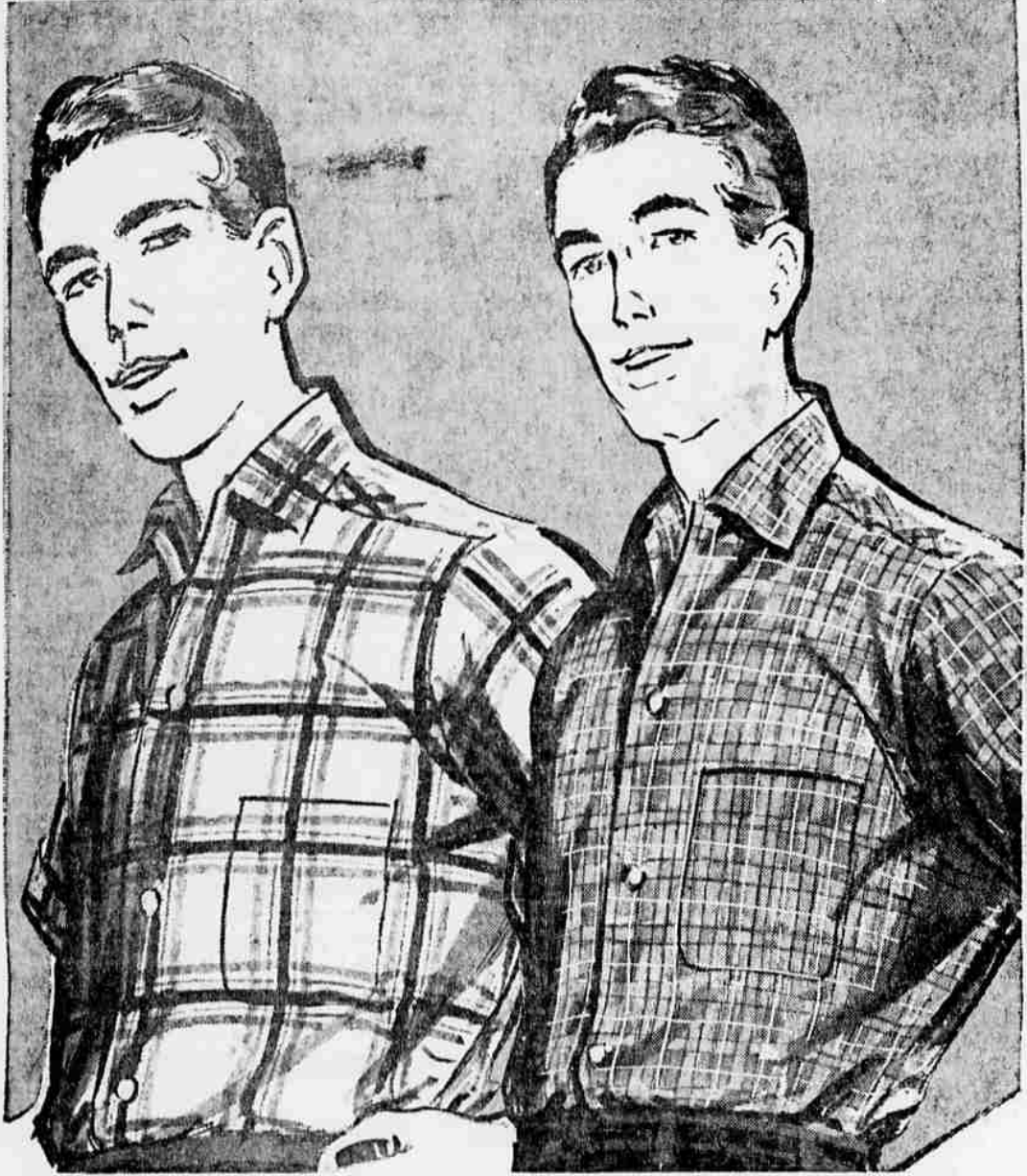
