## Russians Say H-Bombs Tested On Indians

MOSCOW (AP) — Komsomolskaya Pravda, newspaper of Soviet youth, told its readers Tuesday the United States plans to test hydrogen weapons on Indians in the Brazilian jungles.

Quoting the East German Communist newspaper Neues Deutschland as its source, it said the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission picked the Brazilian jungles to test the action of strontium-90, the potentially death-dealing fallout from hydrogen weapons, on human beings.

## Holmes Laments Failure Of State Power Bill

PORTLAND (AP) — Gov. Robert Holmes lamented here that the recent Legislature did not create a state power commission or enlarge the state Supreme Court.

The Republicans blocked these moves, he told the Portland City Club.

He said the power commission, armed with a preference clause that would have kept "power from draining away from Oregon."

The governor also said that Republicans blocked the move to add two judges to the Supreme Court because they did not want a Democratic governor appointing the judges.

Holmes defended the tax program passed by the Legislature, and said that if the Republicans had been in control they probably would have turned to a sales tax.
