Huge Missile Lands Near Group Of Children

ERICA, Va. (AP)—A huge missile fell 50 yards from a group of children in a group of summer cottages Wednesday, and the Navy Thursday identified it as a "conventional target projectile."
No one was injured.
A spokesman at Dahlgren Naval Proving Grounds said the non-explosive missile was fired down range from a 16-inch gun on the grounds at a target in the Potomac River. The spokesman said the missile misfired.
Dahlgren is about 25 air miles away from this Westmoreland County resort community.
The missile missed a cottage by several yards, landed in the backyard and burrowed out of sight in a hole more than 10 feet wide.
The Navy said an investigation is under way to determine what caused the misfiring.
