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Safeway Stores Fined, Officials Given Sentences

FORT WORTH, Tex. (AP)—Safeway Stores Inc., was fined \$105,000 in U. S. District Court Tuesday for violation of federal antitrust laws. Two officials of the concern were given one-year suspended prison terms and fined.

Federal Judge Joe Estes assessed the largest fine ever levied under present federal antitrust cases, said Miss Margaret H. Brass, who headed the government's prosecution for the Justice Department.

Lingan A. Warren of Hillsborough, Calif., and New York City was fined \$75,000 and given two one-year prison sentences, suspended.

Warren is a former president of the concern and is now a consultant receiving a percentage of the 1,900-store chain's profits.

Earl Cliff of Dallas, manager of the Dallas division of Safeway, was fined \$7,500 and given a one-year suspended sentence.

"This is not a price fixing case," said Elton L. Marshall of Kansas City, chief defense counsel. "The only charge against us is that we sold below cost and for the purpose of destroying competition."

"To sell below cost is not a law violation, and there is no such thing as a price war with only one concern. There must be another. Our competitors sold below costs, too, and the ads so show we have a right to meet price," Marshall declared.

The corporation and the two officers involved threw themselves on the mercy of the court with "no contest" pleas.

The government charged Safeway engaged in a vicious price cutting war to drive competitors out of business in Texas and New Mexico.

Farmers' Voting Set On Keeping Federal Control

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Agriculture Department will hold a referendum Thursday in which probably less than one-fourth of the affected growers will decide whether rigid federal controls will be continued on the 1958 wheat crop.

Officials estimated that about 950,000 growers in 36 wheat-growing states will be eligible to cast ballots. But on the basis of past referendums, the chances are that only a small fraction of the farmers will vote.

In a similar referendum a year ago, 261,000 votes were cast. Of this number, 228,000, or 87 per cent, favored marketing quotas on this year's crops. Approval by at least two-thirds of those voting is required to make controls effective.

Officials said field reports indicate that Thursday's election might be close because of strong opposition to controls in the Southwestern Plains where replenished soil moisture supplies provide the base for possible big wheat crops next year, and in the Pacific Northwest.

But officials expected a heavy turnout of "yes" votes in the upper plains, particularly in the Dakotas and Minnesota, where the National Farmers Union has waged a vigorous campaign for the controls. This organization has warned of a possible sharp drop in wheat prices if the quotas are defeated.

Singer Melchior Robbed By Three Gunmen Tues.

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Three gunmen Tuesday night invaded the home of opera star Lauritz Melchior and robbed him of furs, cash and jewelry he said were worth almost \$250,000.

The men fled in an old sedan after binding Melchior, his wife Kleinfen and two employees.

The Danish-born singer said he was watching television in his hill-top home on Mulholland Drive when the three tall men, wearing masks and armed with 45-caliber pistols, forced their way in.

Melchior, 67, told newsmen later: "If only I'd gotten to my gun in time."

Life In Prison Meted Klamath Wife Slayer

KLAMATH FALLS (AP)—Osborne Lee "Beegie" Hall, convicted of second degree murder in the slaying of his wife, Tuesday was sentenced to life in prison by Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg.

He was convicted of the pistol shot slaying of his wife, Frances, at their home in Chiloquin, April 4.

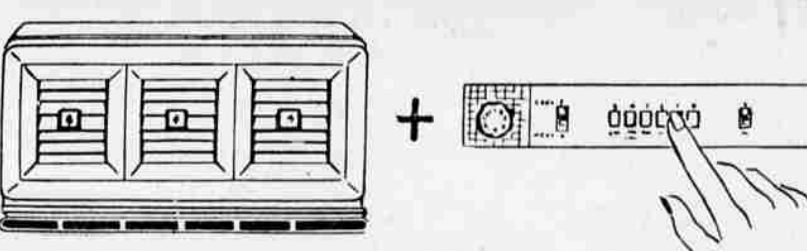

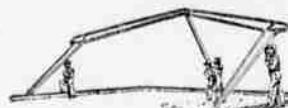
