Cracks About House Often Spell Danger

Check your home now for these danger points in cracks: ends of eaves at the construction joints; siding and lap joints of siding; window frames, storm sash, wood doors and window frames where they meet masonry, openings for outside water faucets and where pipes pass through walls, flashings and corner joints. Cracks in masonry, foundation joints and concrete step risers call for special measures and materials.

Every new house, no matter how well built, is quite likely to develop a variety of cracks and crevices at the construction joints over a period of time. Failure to fill these cracks can be costly in the long run.

Moisture seeping in cracks can cause rotting and heat will escape. Dirt and insects can get in through cracks.

The caulking job itself can be done easily and inexpensively by the average homeowner using one of the compounds that come in large-size foldup metal tubes.

French Premier Follows Program Of Predecessor

PARIS — Premier Maurice Bourges-Maunoury, after only eight days in office, puts before the National Assembly Friday the issue most likely to bring down his government.

His Cabinet Wednesday night agreed on virtually the same program of higher taxes as the one on which the conservatives topped the government of Socialist Premier Guy Mollet May 21.

The Cabinet authorized Bourges-Maunoury to call for a vote of confidence on the program. After an Assembly debate that is scheduled to begin Friday and wind up Monday.

Despite opposition already being expressed, there was firm belief in some quarters that the program would not be defeated again. The prospect for any kind of Cabinet different from the present minority grouping virtually is nonexistent, and it was not believed that the Assembly would want to bring about the same crisis so soon again.

Aged Woman Falls 250 Feet Over Cliff, Survives

BROOKINGS, Ore. — A 73-year-old Brookings woman, prowling the oceanside looking for gold, fell off a 250-foot cliff Tuesday and survived.

The woman, Winnie Hapenstall, was unconscious when searchers spotted her at the base of a cove cliff. Rescuers were unable to reach her from the beach and summoned boats and a Coast Guard helicopter.

The helicopter was unable to come immediately and the boat could not enter the cove because of waves. So Dr. David Brown of Brookings and six other men went over the side of the cliff on ropes.

They administered blood plasma and oxygen. But then the tide was out and, carrying the unconscious woman, they waded through waist-deep water, around one point of the cove to safety.

She was taken to a Crescent City, Calif., hospital for treatment of injuries, extent of which was not immediately determined.

Rescuers said that the cliff was 250 to 300 feet high, and that the woman apparently had hit only once or twice against the side in her fall.

The accident occurred about nine miles north of the southern Oregon coastal town at Whale Head Ranch, where Mrs. Hapenstall lived many years ago.

More recently she has lived alone at Brookings. Neighbors said she spent much of her time looking for gold.

Investigators Find Hungarians Spurred By Radio

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. — U. N. investigators concluded Thursday that the general tone of Radio Free Europe's (RFE) broadcasts to Hungary during last fall's uprising "aroused an expectation of support" and hope that a U. N. force would be sent.

However, the General Assembly's five-nation special committee on Hungary found no evidence that the anti-Communist radio actually promised the Hungarian rebels military help.

The committee was named Jan. 10 to investigate Soviet suppression of the revolt. Its 391-page report, made public Thursday, included findings on RFE's influence on the Hungarian population during the rebellion. Some French newspapers, Hungarians and Germans had charged that the station's broadcasts built up a false impression that the anti-Russian freedom fighters could expect help from the West.

RFE is a privately financed, American-sponsored agency that broadcasts to the Soviet satellites from West Germany.

It denied in January it made any "direct promises of help." It conceded the "sense of urgency" in the voices of some Hungarian escapees broadcasting to their homeland probably gave the Hungarians a "wrong impression" that RFE was urging them on.

The U. N. report said "the committee feels that in such circumstances the greatest restraint and circumspection are called for in international broadcasting."

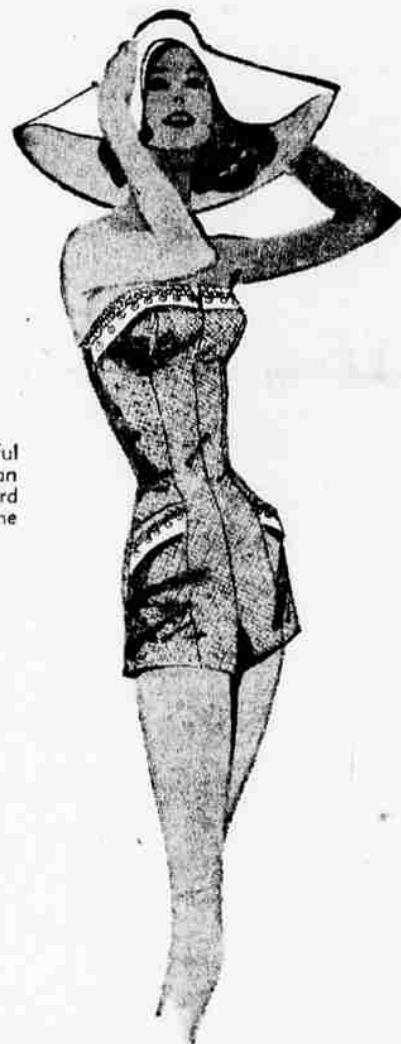
