U. S. Dist. Judge Refuses To Set Aside Conviction

WASHINGTON — U. S. Dist. Judge Charles F. McLaughlin refused Friday to set aside the contempt of Congress conviction which playwright Arthur Miller had attacked on the basis of recent Supreme Court rulings.

The judge, however, set aside Miller's conviction on one of the two contempt counts on which McLaughlin had adjudged the writer guilty May 31. The effect of the ruling was to hold that one of the two counts was not covered by the high court's June 17 ruling in the Watkins case.

McLaughlin ruled that on one count Miller made no objection that the question he refused to answer was not pertinent to the inquiry conducted by a house subcommittee on an American activities a year ago.

Accordingly, the judge held, the Subcommittee was under no requirement to tell Miller the manner in which the question was pertinent. The committee at the time was investigating misuse of American passports.

Philippines Ambassador Proposes U. N. Radiation Committee View Bomb Test

SAN FRANCISCO — Gen. Carlos P. Romulo of the Philippines Thursday proposed that the 15-nation Atomic Radiation Committee of the United Nations be invited to watch nuclear test explosions by the United States, the Soviet Union and the United Kingdom.

Romulo, Philippine ambassador to the United States and his country's representative on the U. N. Security Council, made the proposal in a speech to the 40th annual convention of Lions International.

"Can this be a step which one or all will make as a start away from the deadlock that has too long plagued us?" he asked. The ambassador noted that the U. N. Scientific Committee on the Effects of Atomic Radiation, set up in 1955 with 15 member nations, including the three now in possession of atomic bombs, must report by July 1, 1958 on the amount of radiation to which mankind is being exposed.

Romulo told the convention that after watching the recent telecast interview of Soviet Party Chief Khrushchev in Moscow, he addressed an open letter to him, asking him if he would be willing to invite observers from non-Communist countries to witness the next Soviet atomic explosion, and watch what precautions are taken "to reduce the hazard of radioactive contamination of the air, the land and the water which is the common heritage of man."

He told Khrushchev he hoped this "small step" might lead to others, perhaps limiting the number of explosions under international agreement.
