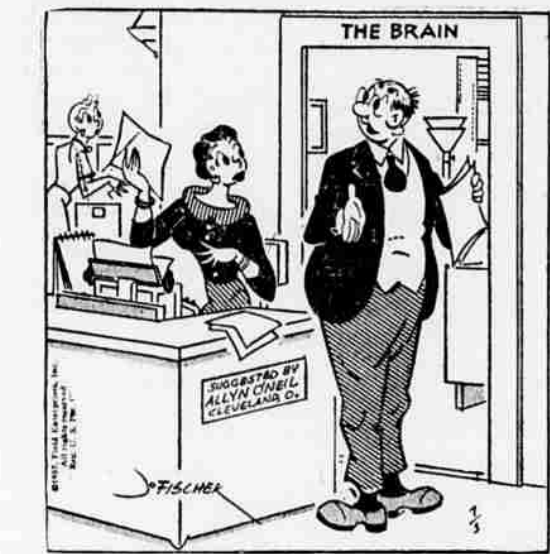


ACCIDENT VICTIM

Grants Pass Publisher Observes 60th Anniversary

GRANTS PASS — Amos E. Voochies observed Monday the 60th anniversary of his ownership of the Grants Pass Courier. As usual, he turned up at the office for his daily stint.
It was a weekly newspaper—then called the Rogue River Courier—when Voochies, an unemployed printer, took it over in 1897.
It had changed hands six times in six years, but Voochies nevertheless thought it had a future. So, lacking funds, he set out on a bicycle to pedal 40 miles to Ashland to find a partner to back him. He found him in C. S. Price, who withdrew two years later because there was not enough profit for two men.
In 1910, Voochies changed the newspaper to a daily.
He now heads the corporation that publishes the newspaper, is president of the Southern Oregon Broadcasting Co., which operates radio station KUN, heads the Oregon Broadcasting Co., which is half owner of station KPIC-TV, at

Roseburg; the California-Oregon Broadcasting Co., which controls KBES-TV at Medford and KOTV-TV at Klamath Falls, and is secretary of the Oregon Caves resort.
Associated with him at the newspaper are his son, Earle, secretary and business manager, and his grandson, John.

Filipinos Picket United States Embassy

MANILA — Police today arrested five Filipinos picketing the U.S. Embassy to protest the return of an American sailor to the United States while charges were pending against him in a Philippine court.
The five young men were taken to a police station, questioned and released.
They carried placards demanding the return of George E. Roe, Clio, Mich., who formerly was stationed at the U.S. naval base at Sangley Point. He was involved in an automobile accident at Cavite Jan. 1, 1956, in which a Filipino was injured.

Mounting Misery Besets Cleanup In Louisiana

LAKE CHARLES, La. — Mass removal and burial of hurricane dead from the ravaged Gulf Coast of Louisiana went on today. But mounting misery beset cleanup workers and slowed their progress.

The Red Cross reported of Cameroun, the little fishing village that was the focal point of last Thursday's great storm: "It is well-nigh impossible for even the strongest of men to stay in the place, much less work."

A check showed 267 bodies brought out so far from the disaster area in the southwestern tip of the state.
The latest estimate of total dead from Hurricane Audrey's onslaught was 500. It was made by Val Peterson in a telephone report to President Eisenhower.
Damage to crops, buildings and livestock was incalculable. Some idea of its multimillion-dollar toll came from oil editor Jeff Davis of the New Orleans Times-Picayune. He estimated damage to petroleum properties alone at 20 million dollars.

PORTLAND — Rates at Portland's seven major hospitals went up \$1.50 Monday—to \$17.75 a day for a ward bed.
The executive committee of the Portland Council of Hospitals said the increase reflected rising operating costs.
Costs at Salem also advanced \$1.50 a day to \$17.50 for certain beds.

Portland Firm Awarded OTI Study Contract

SALEM — A Portland firm has been awarded a \$9,000 contract to make a comprehensive study of Oregon Technical Institute, near Klamath Falls.
John F. Richardson, director of the Department of Finance and Administration, said Monday that Stevens and Thompson, Portland consulting engineers, will make a final report on the school by the end of the year.
The state took over the school at the end of the war, from the military. The Ways and Means Committee in the last two legislative sessions has considered whether it is worthwhile to renovate the buildings.
The engineering firm will estimate what should be done.
