

Yoncalla Post Office Moved

After 35 years in the same location on old Highway 99 in Yoncalla, the post office has been moved to a new building on Main Street.

The old office was built in 1922 by a former postmaster, George Edes. It featured locked boxes on the outside of the building making it possible for persons to get their mail at any time.

The new post office, located in the Fred Booth building, will be open from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. Features of the new office include larger quarters and new equipment, such as a safe and canceling machine.

Eldon Lee is serving as postmaster, and Mrs. Bernice Radtke is assistant postmaster. Mrs. Edith Wykowski is substitute postmaster.

Longtime Lumber Worker Retiring

George Justice, 74-year-old master mechanic for U.S. Plywood in Roseburg, will retire Aug. 1, after 19 years of work for the same mill.

In 1938 he started work at the Youngs Bay Co. mill at Warrenton as mechanical superintendent. He came to Roseburg when the mill was moved in 1944 and stayed on when U.S. Plywood bought it last year. He has been an engineering consultant for the new management.

Justice was first employed in the lumber industry in 1900 when he started as a rigger in a Kentucky mill. He was made head sawyer at 19.

He came west in 1911. After retirement he plans to travel in the United States.
