'Black Magic' Motive For Slaying Of Youth

VINELAND, N. J. (AP) — A farm laborer Monday was charged with murdering a 13-year-old boy last October, allegedly to use the lad's skull for black magic. Director of Public Safety Arthur L. Joseph said Juan River Aponte, 47, had signed a statement confessing that he killed Roger Carlotto last Oct. 13 to use the skull to make a love potion so he could cast spells over women.

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
