U. S. Savings Bonds Sales Increase In June

Sales of U. S. savings bonds this year show a slight increase over the amount sold during the first six months of 1956, a monthly sales report showed today.

Sales lagged behind 1956 until June, when \$70,884 worth of bonds were sold, compared to \$53,552 last year. For the first six months,

\$497,823 have been sold this year, compared to \$492,126 in 1956.

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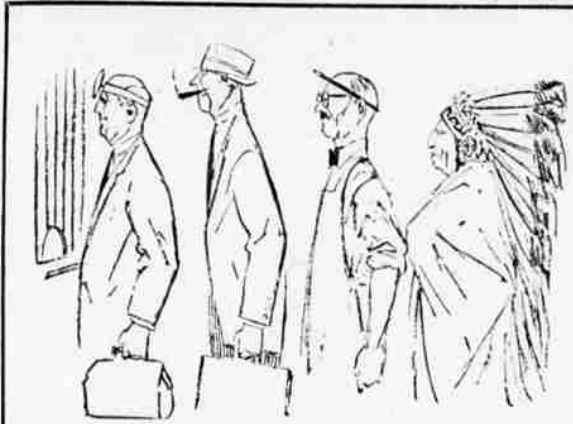
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
