Roseburg Sailor Bound For Arctic

At least one Roseburg man left last week with the fleet being sent to the Arctic to supply the newly Distant Early Warning System of warning defenses at the top of the world.

Leaving with the fleet was Kenneth C. Cook, a petty officer with the U.S. Coast Guard. His ship left Seattle July 16 with the DEW-line supply patrol.

He is stationed aboard the ice breaker North Wind, which recently returned from the other end of the world. It had spent six months on Operation Deepfreeze II. The North Wind, on which Cook is stationed, was the last ship to leave the Antarctic this year.

The ship was damaged in the ice and went to Wellington, N. Z., for five weeks. Then it returned with supplies to Little America. On its return to the U. S., it stopped in Sydney, Australia, and in Honolulu, Hawaii.

Cardinal Spellman May Succeed Aged Pontiff

NEW YORK — The Vatican-approved biographer of Pope Pius XII said Tuesday that Francis Cardinal Spellman of New York is "mentioned very prominently" in Rome as a possible successor to the 81-year-old pontiff.

Seamus Walshe, an Irish educator who is on a sabbatical leave from the Notre Dame International School in Rome, arrived Tuesday aboard the Italian liner Cristoforo Colombo to begin a six-month lecture tour of the United States. He will speak on the Vatican and the life of the Pope.

Archbishop Giovanni Montini, of Milan, is also considered as a possible successor to the throne of St. Peter, Walshe said.

Author of a "human and personal" biography of Pope Pius XII, Walshe is in charge of grammar and high school divisions of the prep school for children of Americans living in Rome.
