It was in the first game of the 1955 spring exhibition series that

Larry Jackson led a parade of four rookie pitchers who one-hit the New York Yankees 10 and sent sports writers thumbing through rosters and brochures trying to find out something about the St. Louis Cardinals youngsters.

Brooklyn's Dodgers are still trying to find out something about the trim right-hander. After 2 1/2 seasons, all they know is that he's beaten them seven times in nine decisions.

The kid from Idaho, who jumped from the bullpen to become the Cards' ace this season, made it five in a row over the champs last night with a three-single, 3-0 job that hoisted the Cards within half a game of the third place Braves.

Sanford Wins 13th
The National League race tightened up again all along the line as Philadelphia defeated first-place Milwaukee 3-1 with rookie Jack Sanford winning his 13th on a five-hitter. Joe Nuxhall gave up eight hits, but blanked Pittsburgh for a 2-0 Cincinnati victory.

And the Cubs' Don Euston out-dueled Johnny Antonelli for a 2-1 Chicago victory over the New York Giants.

All of which left the Braves in front by one game over Brooklyn, with St. Louis third 1 1/2 back, Cincinnati fourth two games shy, and the Phillies fifth 3 1/2 behind.

In the American League, southpaw Billy Pierce remained the majors' biggest winner with his 14th victory as the second-place Chicago White Sox trimmed the New York Yankees 7-2. Boston beat Kansas City 6-5. Cleveland defeated Washington 4-3, then lost the second game of the two-night pair 6-5. Detroit dumped Baltimore 5-1.

Jackson, who was only 2-2 last season but "saved" 13, won his 11th on the fourth try while striking out eight and walking only two. The 26-year-old didn't allow a runner past second base.

Sal Maglie was the loser against the Cards for a 4-3 season record. Al Dark had two triples for the Redbirds. He scored two runs. Sanford, 28, struck out eight and walked two while handing the

Wenatchee's Chiefs, off on another victory binge that has stretched through six games, clung Thursday to their 1 1/2-game Northwest League lead but were unable to shake off the Eugene Emeralds, nipping at their heels.

Wenatchee squeezed past Salem, 5-4, and Eugene edged Lewiston, 2-1, in Wednesday night action on the Oregon clubs' home grounds. At Yakima, the Bears moved within a game of fourth place by pounding Tri-City, 10-4. The first place Chiefs, who started out the league's second half with eight straight wins, kept their latest string going by squeaking a ninth-inning Salem rally with the tying and winning runs on base.

The Senators had shoved across three runs in the bottom of the ninth and had two men aboard when relief pitcher Jim Bailey came in for Wenatchee and struck out Gene Tansell to end the game. Chico Alvarez' two-run homer in the fifth proved to be the Chiefs' margin of victory.

Dodger Vice-President Sees Switch

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. — Emil Bavasi, vice president of the Brooklyn Dodgers, told the Jacksonville Journal Wednesday the Dodgers would move from Brooklyn to Los Angeles for the 1958 season.

Jack Hairston, Journal sports editor, said he had talked with Bavasi during a brief visit of the official here Tuesday. Bavasi was quoted as saying "the only reason we're going is

because we can't get land for a new stadium. We would build the stadium if they would get us the land but the city fathers are not going to do that. They are no longer attempting to woo us into staying."

"The TV deal is not the big thing. We could get just as lucrative a TV contract in Brooklyn as in Los Angeles."

This was the first definite announcement by any Dodger official that the move will be made in 1958.

In his Brooklyn office Bavasi said "that Jack Hairston jumped to conclusions. I'm afraid I did not say that the Dodgers are moving to Los Angeles next season. I did not say that because I do not know it to be true."

"What I replied to his question regarding moving was that, 'One month ago I would have said that we are staying but now it looks as if we are not wanted in New York or Brooklyn.'"

Hornung Optimistic On All-Star Chances

EVANSTON, Ill. — Paul Hornung, All-America quarterback from Notre Dame, believes the College All-Stars can beat the New York Giants in the midsummer football classic at Soldier Field Aug. 9.

Hornung, however, isn't selling the National Football League champions short.
