

Rademacher Confident After Watching Fight

COLUMBUS, Ga. (AP) — "I don't think he can rough me around," said the Olympic heavyweight boxing champion Pete Rademacher Monday night after watching Floyd Patterson change Hurricane Tommy Jackson into a harmless breeze.

Rademacher, the balding king of the world's amateur heavyweights, is scheduled to meet the 22-year-old Patterson, the professional titlist, in a championship bout in Seattle, Aug. 22.

Patterson, making the first defense of his title, hammered the Hurricane into submission with ease at New York's Polo Grounds Monday night, winning when Referee Ruby Goldstein waved Jackson out in the 10th round.

Rademacher, a former Washington State College football player who calls Grandview, Wash., home, watched the fight via television at his training camp near Columbus.

"I haven't changed my opinion that I can beat him," Rademacher said. "We saw a few things I have to work hard on."

"I couldn't see any big difference or improvement in Patterson's fight Monday night. The result was good. It means the fight is on. I'll work that much harder."

"After seeing Patterson hit Jackson at least three times with his best shot and fail to score a clean knock-out, I concluded he hasn't developed real power."

"I'm bigger and stronger. And I think I've got pretty quick hands for a big man. I'll come in weighing about 210 pounds. I don't think he can rough me around."

Outbreak Of Anthrax Reported In Oklahoma

VINETA, Okla. (AP) — An outbreak of deadly anthrax among livestock has resulted in the northern two-thirds of Craig County being placed under quarantine.

Dr. N. M. Reimschneider, state veterinarian, said at least 100 animals have been slaughtered and burned on the spot. He pointed out the bacteria survive in the soil for years sometimes and that it is imperative that the animals be destroyed immediately by fire.

At least 27 farms and ranches have lost animals, he said. Some 13,000 animals have been vaccinated against anthrax, a disease that affects their spleen.

July 4 Fireworks Blast Proves Fatal To Man

SILVER CITY, N.M. (AP) — Melvin H. Porterfield, 41, Silver City businessman, died in a hospital here Tuesday of complications from injuries suffered in a Fourth of July fireworks explosion.

Porterfield, the president of E. Cosgrove Inc., a retail and wholesale hardware and mining supply firm, suffered a shattered right leg and lost four fingers on his right hand when an aerial bomb exploded during a community fireworks display on the Fourth of July. He was aiding in setting off the fireworks at the time.

Death was believed caused by a blood clot.

A second victim of the explosion was Bill Ward, who lost his right arm in the blast. Ward has been released from the hospital.

Monday night, the 26-year-old lefty did all he could to help regain the lead, pitching a two-hitter that beat Pittsburgh 4-0. It was the eighth victory—and third shutout—in 10 games for the Cards, who stayed second as Milwaukee staged a four-run ninth-inning rally and then pushed over a 10th-inning run to beat the New York Giants 9-8.

That left the Braves three percentage points ahead of the Cardinals. The Dodgers' hold on third place was shaved to half a game as the Philadelphia Phillies, behind Robin Roberts' four-hitter, defeated the Chicago Cubs, 6-0.

In the American, Southpaw Billy Pierce won his 15th with a four-hitter as the second-place Chicago White Sox trimmed Baltimore 5-0. Boston beat Cleveland 6-2 in the only other game scheduled.

A six-run rally in the top of the eighth inning gave the Green girls a 18-13 victory over Myrtle Creek in a Timberettes League softball game Sunday at Myrtle Creek. The win for Green now gives it a two-win and two-loss record for the year.

Accused Girl Quiet During Arraignment

SAN MATEO, Calif. (AP)—Elaine Soule, 19-year-old secretary from Freeport, N.Y., spoke but few words Monday when she was arraigned in municipal court for the slaying of her roommate, Catherine Elvins, Whitman College student.

She corrected Judge J. A. Branson when he mispronounced her name as "Miss Soule." The blonde girl said it was "Sou-lay."

Then she answered "yes" to a question as to whether that was her correct name.

Police say the girl has admitted slaying her Seattle roommate, also 19, in their nearby Burlingame apartment last Wednesday.

As Miss Soule left the courtroom here, Frank, who had flown here from Freeport, hurried to catch her. He held her hand tightly when she descended the stairs leading to the police car.

He kissed her on the cheek as a matron escorted her to a car for the trip back to the jail.

"Goodbye, sweetie," he called. She did not answer.

Her attorney, John McKenna, said he would have his tall client examined by a psychiatrist.

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Polish Press Devoting Space To Warsaw Fight

PARIS (AP) — For the first time in 10 years, the Polish press is devoting entire pages to articles on the ill-fated Warsaw uprising against the Nazis in August 1944, a virtual taboo during the Stalin era.

And for the first time, in newspapers and magazines reaching Paris, there was almost no mention of the activities of Red units. The previous infrequent articles on the 63-day fight told only of Communist participation.

The uprising by a 30,000-man underground army under the command of the exiled Polish government in London began Aug. 1, 1944. It collapsed when the Soviet armies across the Vistula failed to help. Some 250,000 people were killed and Warsaw was 90 per cent destroyed.

BRUCKER IN PARIS

PARIS (AP) — U.S. Army Secretary Wilbur M. Brucker flew to Paris Tuesday to start an inspection of American Army installations in Europe and visits to Atlantic alliance partners.

During his 15-day tour Brucker will also visit West Germany, Denmark, Norway and Iceland.

AGREES TO SUPPLIES

DAMASCUS, Syria (AP) — The independent newspaper Al Alam reported in dispatch from Moscow Tuesday the Soviet Union has agreed to supply Syria with a radio station, chemical laboratories and rail trains. A Syrian delegation is now negotiating in Moscow.

Maritime Representatives Invited To Discuss Advent Of Nuclear-Powered Ships

WASHINGTON (AP) — Representatives of the maritime industry were invited today to discuss the benefits and problems expected with the advent of nuclear-powered merchant ships.

The session was arranged by the Maritime Administration, the Commerce Department and the Atomic Energy Commission. It has three objectives:

1. To give representatives of the shipping lines a report on the present state of development of a merchant ship-type reactor.
2. To discuss probable operation problems of merchant ships in foreign commerce.
3. To get the views of the industry on requirements for the types of nuclear propelled ships on a specific trade routes.

The government already has started a project for development and construction of a prototype merchant ship using a nuclear engine. Congress provided 42½ million dollars for the program.

The power plant for this test craft will be a pressurized water system, similar in design to that used in the first nuclear submarine, the Nautilus, and in other submarines now being built.

The general design of the prototype merchant ship will meet the requirements of a commercial vessel. However, it is being assembled in a manner which permits changes as the trials proceed.

Government officials already have suggested that at the outset costs for nuclear fuel will be greater than for standard fuel—about 70 cents per million British thermal units (BTU) as compared with an average of 25 cents for fuel oil. However, government experts

Morse Says FPC Should Reopen Snake Hearings

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Federal Power Commission should reopen hearings on the Pacific Northwest Power Co.'s proposed construction of dams in the Snake River, Sen. Morse (D-Ore.) said Monday in a Senate speech.

He said that Oregon's Gov. Robert Holmes has asked reopening of the hearings so the views of his state administration can be put into the record.

Last week an FPC examiner recommended that the company, a combine of utilities, be granted a license to build Mountain Sheep and Pleasant Valley dams.

Shipyard Unions Vote On New Wage Program

PORTLAND (AP) — Shipyard unions in the Portland area are voting this week on a wage program. The Portland Metal Trades Council opposes the plan and has urged that it be rejected.

The proposal calls for a 15-cent hourly wage increase plus five paid holidays. The increase would raise the journeyman scale to \$2.62 an hour.

Similar elections are being held in Seattle, San Francisco and other shipyard cities.
