Guatemala President Selecting New Cabinet

GUATEMALA (AP)—Acting President Arturo Gonzalez today was reported putting together a new Guatemalan cabinet.

Eduardo Rodriguez, interior minister in the government of assassinated President Carlos Castillo Armas, told reporters the old cabinet had resigned to permit the acting president to name a new one.

Unofficial sources said Gonzalez would appoint the widow of the

slain President as Minister of education. Gonzalez said Mrs. Castillo Armas had offered to help the government carry out her husband's social and economic program and that he might name her to a Cabinet post.

Castillo Armas was shot and killed by a member of his palace guard last Friday night. Gonzalez stepped up from the vice presidency.

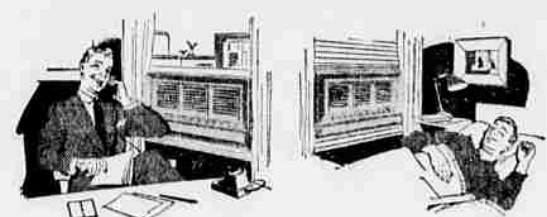
