Fire Sweeps Through Dairy Near Portland

PORTLAND — A fire swept through the Alpenrose Dairy barn and loading shed early Saturday, destroying 12 dairy cows.

Damage was estimated at between \$90,000 and \$100,000.

Cause of the blaze was not determined immediately, but firemen were studying the possibility of arson.

A year's supply of alfalfa went up in flames. The alfalfa alone was valued at \$28,000.

Owner Henry Cadonau brought up the question of arson. He said two small boys were seen sneaking away from the barn area last night. He added that twice in the past 10 days, folders of burned matches have been found on top of a bale of hay inside the barn.

ABANDONS PLANS

WASHINGTON — The Communications Commission said Friday it has abandoned tentative plan to limit grants of TV translator stations to locations in which no regular TV outlet is operating.

The Commission said that instead the matter will be decided on a case-by-case basis as applications are filed.

The translators generally relay TV programs into remote areas unable to support a local outlet.

U. S. Musk Ox Herd Increasing

JUNEAU — America's musk ox population has increased to 142 head, the Fish and Wildlife Service reports.

The herd, confined to 75-mile-long Nunivak island in the Bering Sea, has picked up 16 new members since the last census a year ago.

The woolly, blunt-nosed animals, native to the Arctic regions of the world, were reintroduced into Alaska in 1930 after whalers and traders had wiped them out in easy kills.

Urban C. (Pete) Nelson, chief of wildlife restoration for the FWS in Alaska said the last native musk ox disappeared in Alaska about 1875. To get a new herd going, the government imported 34 of the animals from Greenland and put them on the national wildlife refuge at Nunivak.

The island is also populated by more than 4,000 reindeer.

Oil Drilling Will Be Resumed At Fossil Well

FOSSIL, Ore. — Oil drilling is to be resumed at a Wheeler County well abandoned in 1937, the head of an oil company said Friday.

The well in the Clarno Basin 18 miles southeast of here was drilled to 4,284 feet in 1937.

Claude B. Brown, president of the Oregon Petroleum Corp., which will do the drilling, said geological reports indicate there is oil in the area.

He said the company, which has no stock for sale, was formed about three months ago by California and Texas backers. The company holds leases on 58,000 acres in Wheeler County and on 80,000 acres around Durkee in Baker County, Brown said.
