The change was announced yesterday by the State Agriculture Department. It made the 7 per cent order originally in order to keep peach supply in balance with demand. The percentage was cut after crop estimates were found to have been high.

Porter To Seek Rogue Project Work Approval

WASHINGTON (AP)—A bill was introduced by Rep. Porter (D-Ore) Thursday that would provide for government development of units of the Rogue River Basin Project.

Estimated cost of the development would be 68½ million dollars.

As flood control measures, the bill would authorize construction of the Lewis Creek Dam, reservoir and power plant; Trail Diversion Dam and power plant; Pease Bridge, Meadows, Ruch, Slate Creek, Indian Hill and Deer Creek dams and reservoirs; and Cascade Gorge Dam and power plant.

Also authorized would be tunnels, canals and drainage systems, pumping facilities and transmission lines.

Porter's bill would set up a one million dollar Rogue River development fund in which appropriations resulting from the bill would be used to promote re-adjustment and development of the

areas in the basin directly affected by the projects.

Money for conservation facilities and the re-establishment of fish and wild-life resources, establishment of public park facilities, fish hatcheries and wild-life refuges would come out of the development fund.

The bill would authorize additional funds—apart from the 68½ million dollars—to take care of changes in construction costs or operation and maintenance of the proposed works.

Fox Terrier Produces 15 Pups On Air Journey

BALTIMORE (AP)—When Raffles, an overgrown fox terrier, left Houston, Tex., by plane Saturday, she knew she was in a family way. So did the pilot of the freight plane.

But neither the pilot, Capt. Peter Kooyenga, nor Raffles knew what was to come.

Raffles had to change planes in Chicago and that's where she gave birth to eight pups.

Between Chicago and Baltimore, Raffles produced seven more pups—a grand total of 15. All were doing nicely when the plane landed last night.

Slick Airways notified the Baltimore consignee, Dr. William C. Brown, to expect not one fox terrier, but 16. It said there would be no extra charge.

China Calls Vatican Imperialism Instrument

VATICAN CITY (AP)—Vatican sources Saturday interpreted the bitter Red Chinese attacks against the Vatican as an intensified campaign to establish a separate Roman Catholic Church in China and cut its members from the authority of the Pope.

These sources recalled that Pope Pius XII, when he was recovering from his serious illness in 1954, issued an encyclical letter urging Chinese Catholics to resist the Red regime's so-called "national church."

This letter followed charges then made against the Vatican by China's Communist authorities similar to those now being made.

There were about three million Roman Catholics in China before the Communist regime took control. How many Roman Catholics there may be in the country now is unknown, Vatican sources said.

Youths Jailed For Money Trap

PORTLAND (AP)—Two youths, accused of attempted burglary of a night depository at a Salem bank with a money trap, were held in jail here Saturday in lieu of \$5,000 bail.

In an appearance before U. S. Robert Santoiana Jr., head of the FBI here, said the youths stuffed a cloth and wire contraption into the night depository chute of the Commercial Bank and then waited a round for a customer to deposit some money, apparently planning to steal it.

Santoiana said he believed that no deposits were made and no money taken.

The device slipped down in the vault when the youths tried to take it out, he said.

A Salem resident noted the two

men near the bank last Thursday night and reported the license number to police. That led to their capture.

Santoiana said the trick is an "old one that has been tried unsuccessfully many times before."
