Two Atlantic Fleet Subs Collide At Sea Tuesday

WASHINGTON, Aug. 6—Two Atlantic Fleet submarines collided at sea early Tuesday. The vessels were damaged slightly but the crews escaped injury, the Navy reported.

The submarines were the Tusk based at New London, Conn., and the Cobbler, a unit of Submarine Squadron Six at Norfolk, Va. The vessels headed for New London under their own power.

The Navy said the submarines were engaged in routine submerged operations when they collided at 4:39 a.m. (EST) about 100 miles south of New London.

In messages to Atlantic Fleet submarine headquarters in New London, the commanders of both vessels reported "only minor damage and no injuries to personnel."

The Navy said an investigation will be conducted.
