Eisenhower Orders Ban On Butterfat Imports

WASHINGTON — President Eisenhower ordered a ban Wednesday on imports of all products containing more than 45 per cent butterfat, Rep. Westland (R-Wash) was notified by the White House.

Westland said the President also asked Secretary of Agriculture Benson to keep close check and report back to him on the amount of products with less than 45 per cent butterfat content that are entering the country.

The Republican congressman termed the step a major importance to the dairying industry. He said he wrote Eisenhower three weeks ago urging such a ban.

Westland said foreign countries had been getting around the tariff barrier by disguising butterfat concentrates in other products.
